Through his Paschal Mystery, the Lord Jesus redeemed the human race and gave perfect glory to the Father. By dying, Christ destroyed our death; by rising, he restored our life. For this reason, the Easter Triduum, when we celebrate the suffering, death, and resurrection of our Lord, is the high point of the liturgical year. The Easter solemnity is to the year what Sunday is to the week. The celebration of the Easter Triduum opens with the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper, reaches its climax in the Easter Vigil, and closes with Evening Prayer II on Easter Sunday.

Good Friday



The Church of God fasts today and tomorrow to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare to share more deeply in the joy of his resurrection. Good Friday is a universal day of fasting and abstinence. There are two solemn liturgical celebrations on Good Friday-at 10:30 am & 3:00 pm.

Presentation of the Oils
Washing of Feet
Mass of the Lord's Supper followed by
Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament until midnight

Holy Thursday

Mass of the Lord's Supper at 7:00 pm -This holy Mass holds special significance for the ENTIRE COMUNITY! The Lord invites us to share in this Eucharist, as he shared with his apostles on that first Holy Thursday, the night before he suffered and died. After communion, the "Blessed Sacrament", Jesus the "Living Bread" will be carried to an altar of reposition until midnight. The faithful are invited to visit and pray before the Blessed Sacrament until midnight, at which time the church will be locked. The significance of this practice lies in the fact that Jesus left the Upper Room, the Last Supper Room, in Jerusalem and entered the Garden of Gethsemane to pray, in agony, to his Father before his arrest. We are invited to enter with Jesus into a deep experience of prayer. Jesus invites us, as he invited his apostles to "pray that you may not enter into temptation." Holy Thursday leads US into the heart of the Paschal Mystery, the Holy Triduum, Jesus' death and resurrection. We may watch from a distance, but Jesus invites us to enter into the very heart of this holy time.

Following the ancient roman custom, the Eucharist is not celebrated today. Only one cross is venerated and brought into the Sanctuary.

A gesture of veneration may be to touch the cross, kiss it, bow to it, or genuflect. Our offering on Good Friday will be given to our Together We Serve appeal, which helps support the Needs of the Church in the Holy Land.

Holy Saturday and Easter Vigil

On Holy Saturday, the people of God remain in recollection at the tomb of the Lord, meditating on his sufferings and death, refraining from celebrating the Eucharist until the Vigil. Throughout this day, the faithful are invited to continue the solemn paschal fast which they began on Good Friday. The Easter Vigil begins at 9:00 pm. According to the ancient tradition of vigils, the Christian people spend the night in prayer, singing hymns and listening to the word of God. Toward dawn, the traditional time for the resurrection, they celebrate the Eucharist. The Easter Vigil is also the time for celebrating the initiation of adults (through baptism, confirmation, and Eucharist) into the Christian community. Tonight the community gathers as servants, ready with lamps (vigil candles) burning for their master's return, so that when he arrives, he will find them awake and will seat them at his table. With the liturgy of the Eucharist, Easter begins in a spirit of joy which we will celebrate for the next fifty days.

March 20 - Passion (Palm) Sunday The Road to Discipleship: Who is the greatest?

Our world is built on competition, not cooperation. Even the disciples jockeyed for position and favour. Jesus chides them that they must be the ones who serve, like he is. He tells Simon Peter, "Satan has demanded to sift all of you like wheat, but I have prayed for you that your own faith may not fail." Luke talks a lot about discipleship, and that being a disciple means following after the master, the King, and learning to think, act, love, and forgive like he does. In today's Gospel, Simon Peter denies Jesus and runs away. Simon of Cyrene is conscripted to take up the Cross and follow Jesus. Which one really serves? And which Simon are you?

received Holy Communion at Holy Mass. It may be said at any time, but our Lord specifically told St. Faustina to recite it during the nine days before the Feast of Mercy (the first Sunday after Easter). He then added: "By this Novena, (of Chaplets) I will grant every possible grace to souls." There is a box in the foyer for your prayer intentions which will be offered at the Divine Mercy.
