

July 3 - Fourteenth Sunday In Ordinary Time

Last Sunday, Jesus rebuked James and John for wanting to “call down fire from heaven” (Luke 9:54–55) on an unwelcoming town. As he sends forth disciples today, Jesus again forbids retaliation against non-receptive listeners (10:10–11), showing us how to be Jesus’ “missionaries of mercy” this Jubilee Year of Mercy. Like the first disciples, we are sent not to proclaim ourselves but Jesus. As Jesus sent them in pairs, so are we also to work together in the community of the Church. We often describe the Church as Isaiah describes Jerusalem in today’s first reading, our comforting, nurturing Mother (Isaiah 66:13). So, going forth gently, like lambs among wolves (Luke 10:3), we share comforting peace, nurturing food and drink (Luke’s image for Eucharist), and Jesus’ healing promise of unfailing, unconditional mercy (10:5, 7, 9). Thus Jesus bids us proclaim the kingdom of God by showing what God’s kingdom looks like in action. “Go, preach the Gospel,” Pope Francis’ saintly namesake of Assisi is said to have instructed his first friars, “and when necessary, use words!”

Thank-You, Thank-You, Thank-You!!

We are all so blessed to be part of such a fantastic parish family, who when asked to help, respond so quickly and so generously. The Society of Saint Vincent de Paul (SSVP) thank all of you who contributed in so many ways to the success of this project. We thank Father Jack and the Pastoral staff for supporting us in whatever we asked in communicating our story and needs in the bulletin, on the screens and in the announcements and in preparing the Reverse collection slips and the ushers for distributing them at Mass. You were wonderful and played an essential part. Thanks also to the many volunteers who helped us collect, sort, box and load the seacan with all the items that you so generously provided us with for the poor in Gjoa Haven. Once again, you were all amazing!

With your help this is what we filled the sea container with:

- \$8500 worth of requested food items. (from Reverse Collection)
- \$750 worth of lumber, nails, tools, etc.
- \$1400 worth of Baby Needs (formula, Diapers)
- \$750 worth of roughneck totes used to pack the items sent and to help them in the storage and distribution of food in Gjoa.

All of the above were either donated by you or purchased with the proceeds from the Poor Box from the June 18-19th week-end.

The remainder of the seacan was filled with the following items which were collected from those things donated to SSVP during the last five months: winter clothing, jeans, runners, bedding, mattresses, step ladder, washing machine, kitchen tables and chairs and 50 sheets of plywood.

SSVP thank-you on behalf of the poor of Gjoa Haven for your response. The seacan should arrive in Gjoa Haven by the end of August.
