From The Pastor's desk.....

- 1. In recent years there has been a dramatic rise in the occurrence of celiac disease, a condition that produces an allergy to gluten, an element in wheat flour. In some people, the reaction to gluten is pronounced, even extreme. This, of course, causes a problem with the reception of Communion.
- 2. An obvious alternative in such cases is to have the celiac sufferer receive Communion from the cup and not receive the wheat host at all. Since the Lord is present in either species, this is a perfectly acceptable way to receive Communion.
- 3. But what if the person is alcohol-intolerant as well? This becomes a real conundrum. Is such a person to be deprived of Communion?
- 4. In an effort to resolve this pastoral problem, we were able to find a supplier of gluten-free hosts, which we ordered and began using. But it was drawn to my attention by Archbishop Smith that such completely gluten-free hosts are not considered valid matter for the Eucharist. The Archbishop, of course, is correct. Church law, canon 924 #2, states, regarding the Eucharistic bread: "The bread must be wheaten only, and recently made, so that there is no danger of corruption."
- 5. I had our staff do some research, and we found a community of Benedictine Sisters in the United States which produces a wheaten host that contains only 0.01% gluten. This, we thought, would be the answer to our problem. Surely the miniscule amount of gluten would be acceptable, we thought, and introduced these LOW-GLUTEN hosts recently.
- 6. We acted too soon, it seems. We were advised that even this tiny amount of gluten cannot be tolerated by some people. So we're back to square one. Or maybe not.
- 7. A conversation with the Archbishop brought to light another possible resolution to the problem. We continue to explore this and will inform you if we meet with success. In the meantime, we will continue to use the Low-gluten hosts and suggest that consuming only a <u>small portion</u> of the host may be acceptable. Those who continue to have a problem in this regard are asked to inform us at the Parish office.
- 8. I apologize for any confusion or concern you may have experienced while we struggled with this perplexing problem in recent weeks.

The stand has been blessed and is positioned in front of the tapestry/icon of Our Lady of Perpetual Help. Vigil lights (from the Latin word vigilia, which means "waiting" or "watching") are lit before an image of our Lord, our Blessed Lady or one of the saints. For Catholics, this practice symbolizes a prayer offering where we present our petition or special need. The light is kept lit to show our desire to remain in God's presence as we go about our daily duties at home or in the workplace.
