Father Jim's Message














Why should I attend an Ash Wednesday celebration?

Ash Wednesday arrives year after year, decade after decade. How does this day that begins our Lenten journey fit into our grand plan for ourselves and for our families? I ask this because we are presented with an opportunity on this day like no other. We are presented with the opportunity to tell the world; *this is who I am and this is what I believe*. You can like me for it or not, but be certain, this is who I am. What do I mean by this somewhat challenging "in your face" statement?

When we attend an Ash Wednesday celebration and have the ashes imposed on our forehead, in all humility, we are making a statement. Whether the words used are; "Turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel" or "Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return" we are committing ourselves to Christ. We are saying, "Lord Jesus Christ, my salvation lies with you". Most of us would agree with this statement but when have the sign of our faith traced on our foreheads at that moment, we become very visible and very present witnesses to all whom we encounter.

Catholic, Christian or any other world faith, generally speaking, when they see a person in the public square with a cross traced on their forehead, they know who we are. In a society where, for instance, in Quebec government employees are not allowed to wear religious symbols in the workplace; Ash Wednesday presents a wonderful opportunity to us. We, simply by our presence in the public sector with ashes on our forehead, are saying, "Lord Jesus Christ, by your cross and resurrection, are my Lord and Savior. You have redeemed the world." It is all well and good to say, I am a Catholic Christian, and to practice our faith on a daily basis. Ash Wednesday provides you and I with the opportunity to

be public witnesses to the world of who we are and what we believe. This is not heroic, it is not an in your face kind of statement. It is simply us saying, this is who I am and this is what I believe, without using words.

I realize that what I write is not read by our young people, but here is the challenge to one and to all. When you attend an Ash Wednesday celebration this week; when you have the ashes imposed upon your forehead, challenge yourself to wear them throughout the day as a badge of honor. A public sign to one and all of who you are and what you believe. You do not have to say a word to anyone. Just be that visible witness in the marketplace. At work, at school, at the grocery store, at dance class and at hockey practice. When we reflect on what Jesus endured on our behalf, and for our salvation, our opportunity to be a public witness to Him seems small enough. The truth is, we will never really know the effect we may have on others simply by publicly being who we are.

My friends, Ash Wednesday is not just another day in the Liturgical year of the Church. It is not just the first day of our Lenten preparations for the celebration of the death and resurrection of our Lord. It is not only one of two days of Fast and Abstinence in the Catholic Church. (Although it is, and Good Friday is the other.) Ash Wednesday is for you and me, a very humble and subtle way of saying to the society we live in; Jesus Christ died and rose so that I might have eternal life. I am grateful and proud to be Catholic.

It is easy to be proud at Mass on Sunday morning. This Wednesday is our opportunity to be proud in the secular marketplace that we live and work. This Wednesday may all of us; "Turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel."
