





Father Jim's Message



Ash Wednesday and Beyond...

A question came to my mind at the 7:00 pm evening Mass on Ash Wednesday - one of the four packed parish Masses, as well as our three school gymnasium packed school Masses. Why do so many people attend Ash Wednesday celebrations? January 1st, the Feast of Mary the Mother of

God is a Holy Day of obligation and we do not get crowds like we do on Ash Wednesday. Easter is the High point of the Church's Liturgical year. Easter is what Ash Wednesday and Lent build up to. Yet Ash Wednesday brings many, many people to worship. Why? I believe it came to me as we prayed the psalm that evening. "Have mercy O Lord, for we have sinned." At the core of our Catholic Christianity, we know that we all fall short of what our God has created us to be. I believe this is the reason so many Christians attend Ash Wednesday celebrations. We know, and trust that our God created us in His image and likeness. We are created good, there is no question about this. In His image and likeness, no less.

That is the paradox and the rub of our created goodness. We know we are created good yet in our hearts we know that we are sinners. That we all fall short of the goodness that we are all called to. This is evidenced to me in the lives of the saints, the holy men and women that the Church holds up as examples of sanctity for us to aspire to. Holy as these women and men were, they almost categorically saw themselves as great sinners. So the paradox is that the more we grow in holiness, the more we come to see the great chasm of distance between who we are, and who God is. Of course the more we come to know of God, the more we want to know of God. The rub, is that as holy as we might ever become, or aspire to be, our human frailty, our sinfulness, becomes so much more apparent to us. I suppose because the contrast between good and bad becomes so much more evident to us. All this to say, that Ash Wednesday is a day that levels the playing field for all Christians, clergy and laity alike. I am sure our Holy Father Pope Francis ensured that he had the cross of palm ashes marked on his forehead, just like any one of us who are feeling very insecure about our lack of holiness.

Repent and be Faithful to the Gospel. Many of us heard these words spoken as we received the cross of ashes on our foreheads. Our Lord gave us two commands that we need to adhere to. Love God and love one another. Flows easily from our mouths, but it is a little easier said than done. To love God and love one another, we need to know that we are loved. Again, easier said than done. Intellectually we know that we are loved by our God, who created us out of His love for us. In any relationship that is important to us, we at times encounter struggle and fall short of living that loving relationship. It is no different in our relationship with Jesus. It is the forgiveness and reconciliation that assists us in really valuing the important relationships in our lives. Knowing that we are not perfect, but that we are loved despite our failings.

Father Jim's Message

When we have the cross of ashes marked on our foreheads, we hear the words, repent and be faithful to the Gospel. What we are really hearing is this: Jesus saying to each of us, I love you, I forgive you. May this cross always be a reminder of what I have done for you. I accepted my passion and death so that you may have life, eternal life.

My friends, salvation came to us through the cross and resurrection of Jesus Christ. These next forty days are an opportunity for you and me to reflect, discern and act on how we can express our gratitude to our God. Love God and love your neighbor. Lent is the opportunity we have been given to grow in these two most beautiful, challenging virtues. Happy Lent.
