

MARY'S SERVANTS FOR CHRIST


Scripture in John 19: 26-27 tells us that Mary was given to us as our mother. As did the disciple John, we, too, can make a place for Mary in our Home.





Sood Things Happening

Last weekend we spoke about several initiatives that are at various stage of progress within our parish from an infrastructure stand-

point. Our parish building is forty plus years of age and it stands to reason that there are numerous areas of focus in order to maintain the Lord's house in a dignified and reverent manner.

There are a couple of things that I believe are essential to healthy pastoral parish life for our parishioners. **One:** We need to assist our people, young and not so young alike, to feel that they are welcome and part of our OLPH parish community. **Two:** The most effective way for us to grow in the most important relationship in our lives is to take advantage of faith development and learning opportunities. Our relationship/friendship with Jesus is **the most important relationship** that we will ever strive to grow in. Practically, we do this by spending time with our Lord, as friends do. Whether in prayer, in learning, in catechetics, in apologetics, it really matters not. **The key is that we commit time to this important relationship.**

My comments are intended to build on the concept of maintaining and upkeeping our parish structure so that it is efficient, pleasing to the eye, and enhances reverence and relationship with our Lord. So the structure provides the ambience, or at least one of a number of ambiences, that can work for us. We then, are invited to make individual commitments in how it is that we will spend time with our Lord on a daily, weekly basis. This will vary from person to person, and depend on what their particular situation in life may be at that moment in time. The important part is that we keep the faith element of our lives in focus, and not lose sight of it, in the busy-ness of life.

I wish to provide a thumbnail today of the opportunities that are so plentiful in our parish community. We provide opportunities to welcome the little ones into our parish community in the sacrament of baptism twice a month, eleven months per year. We operate three separate sacramental program opportunities for Reconciliation and Holy Communion; Fall, Winter and Spring. This so that we ensure that we make it possible for our many young children to receive the sacraments, no matter how busy family life is. Three different opportunities every year. This year for the first time we have offered two separate Confirmation preparation opportunities. Our thinking is that perhaps fall is better for some, and winter and spring may work better for others. We operate a very inclusive and welcoming RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation) program for those who are curious about perhaps becoming Catholic. Good catechists and good formation and good community,

available within our RCIA family.

Our GiFT (Growing in Faith Together) committee continues to add to their repertoire of opportunities for you and I to grow in our faith together, either online or in person. I know of no other parish in the Archdiocese that offers such a plethora of faith and spiritual growth opportunities in an orthodox and community based atmosphere. Truly, there is something for everyone. Please check our website and our bulletin. There are literally opportunities happening year round, online and in person, for us to grow in that most important relationship with our Lord Jesus.

Groups such as St. Vincent De Paul, Clothing Nook, Knights of Columbus, Catholic Women's League; offer us practical hands-on modes of serving the Lord and the community in a very real way. We continue to subscribe to FORMED on your behalf. Formed is my concept of what a Catholic Netflix would look like. There is something for everyone, right in the comfort of your own living room. We have and will continue to bring the Holy Mass to the homes of those who because of age, health, or mobility are unable to join us in person for Mass at Our Lady of Perpetual Help parish. St. Francis of Assisi parish in Tofield, our mission parish, is experiencing a beautiful resurgence within that lovely community. We have done a renovation on the physical structure and lay out of the parish. We have also welcomed a number of new families that have really breathed new life into what had been an aging demographic. Great things happening at St. Francis, including a spot in our bulletin to outline their planned activities. Suffice to say, it is a wonderful treat to attend their monthly first Sunday potluck luncheon that takes place after the 11:00 Mass.

My friends what I have written today is an understated thumbnail of some of the wonderful things that are happening in our parish faith communities. It feels a bit like I am bragging, but I am simply stating facts about our parish. Friends, this is something to be very proud of because within it all we give glory to God. My ask of you is this: Take some time, explore what we have to offer in our parish community. Challenge yourself to choose something that you feel might be of interest to you and then sign up for it. My friends, once we make a small commitment to growing in our relationship with the Lord, the Holy Spirit will guide us where we need to go. There are "Good things happening" in our parish community. The more of you who respond YES to these amazing opportunities, we will move from "Good things happening" to "Great things happening." The cool part is that in this process we ourselves feel more welcome and part of OLPH and we will grow in the most important relationship in our lives. Friends, the doors are wide open. Welcome one and all.
