



Father Jim's Message

Almsgiving

How many of you, when you see the word *almsgiving*, think "O boy, here comes the money talk." That is okay because you are about one third right when you think like that.



Almsgiving is really the culmination of prayer and fasting in one neat little package, but we will get back to that. The concise Catholic Dictionary states: "Almsgiving is a gift, or a compassionate service offered to someone, which is rooted in love for God and human beings. Almsgiving can be an essential work of charity and mercy or a work of penance. In either case, it involves freely giving one's time, presence, money, or material goods, (e.g., clothing) in a spirit of Christian self-discipline and love."

The Christian tradition of almsgiving originates back to the time of Jesus, who taught that we are to support those in need. Matthew 6:2 states, "so whenever you give alms do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing." A way of saying when we give it should not be a calculated process, but one that originates out of love for the other. This makes perfect sense when we consider the definition of love: "To will the good of the other." Most days it is easy to love and will the good of our families, but how do we do outside the four walls of our homes? "Catholic teachings stress that penances and various works of mercy like almsgiving, are signs of real self-giving love and essential to building Christian community and the full realization of the reign of God."

Essentially, we can say almsgiving is the sharing of our Time, Talent, and Treasure with those we know and those we do not know. When you share your time sorting clothing at the Nook or at the SSVP garage you are almsgiving because you are giving of yourself for the benefit of others. In the same way, as you support the poor box collection on the third Sunday of the month, you are sharing your alms for the benefit of those who have far more needs than we ourselves. When you attend a Knights of Columbus pancake breakfast or a Catholic Women's League spring fling or fall bazaar, the money you spend on these activities goes to fund charitable works, for the good of members and groups within our community who need the assistance. There are many modes of almsgiving, but I propose that almsgiving is the good works that result from our prayer and fasting in our own lives. Almsgiving is not linked only to the Church. God's children are everywhere, at the Stollery, Catholic Social Services, Sacred Heart Church, the Bissel and Marian Centers... prayer and fasting will assist us in discerning who we can assist (and how), our sisters and brothers in the Lord.

Father Jim's Message

When we pray, we open our hearts to the guidance of the Holy Spirit, in how it is we are to live our lives. When we fast - whether it be from sweets, from television, from judging others, from fear - the removal of these things from our lives makes more potential room for other ways to share our Time and our Talent! The results from the inspiration of our prayer, the extra time in the day we have from fasting from something, can lead us to look outside of ourselves to the needs of others. I have often said, though similar in sound and spelling, "selfish" is a world away from "selfless" in meaning. **Selfish** is looking inward at what I need and want. **Selfless**, is looking outward at what the needs of others are.

Why should I give alms? Four reasons:

- #1. Jesus told us to. "When you give alms do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, (Mt. 6, 2)."
- #2. We are created in the image and likeness of God, (Gen. 1, 27). Therefore, it is the inherent right of every human being, to be treated with dignity and respect.
- #3. We share our Time, Talent, and Treasure out of gratitude. We know that all we are, all we have, and all we do is a gift of God's love for us. Gifts need to be share. Gratitude is a key first step in this process.
- #4. Because Jesus, who was rich Himself (the Son of God), made Himself poor for our sake.

Oh yeah, #5. "You shall help provide for the needs of the Church" is in fact one of the **Five Precepts of the Church**. (Last week's bulletin topic.)

Almsgiving can be about money, but that is simply one way of expressing our gratitude to our Creator God and love for our neighbor. The prayer and fasting will lead us to a discernment of how it is we are to live out our God-given blessings in our lives. Lent is a most wonderful opportunity to prayerfully take the time, to take stock and discern, how it is we can truly be disciples of Jesus Christ; how we can be His witnesses, His emissaries in the world.
