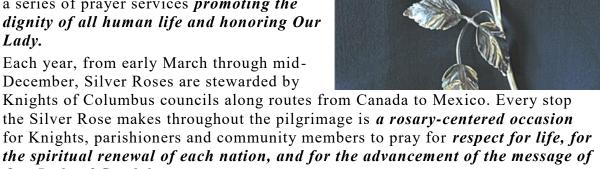

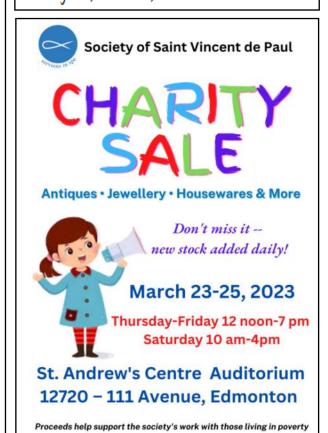

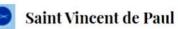

Father Jim's Message

Fasting

At the beginning of Lent, we spoke about pillar number one of our Lenten journeys. That being *prayer*, our primary mode of communication with the Lord. An important way for us to grow in our relationship with Jesus,



in part, because to pray, we need to take the time to spend it with the Lord. No one would deny the importance of pray as a means of our spiritual growth during Lent, or at any other time of year for that matter. Holy Hours and Stations of the Cross, during Lent, are a great way to augment the spiritual practices, (prayer) we may already be doing on a daily basis.

So, what about pillar number two: <u>Fasting</u>? Where does the concept of fasting come into our experience of the Lenten journey? For starters, fasting is not a practice that evolved out of Christianity. The Jewish people in the Old Testament refer to fasting on a regular basis. It is probable that fasting has existed as a form of devotional practice for a long time prior, even to the genesis of Judaism.

During Lent, when we mention the word *fast*, our minds tend to go to abstaining from meat on Fridays or perhaps "giving something up" for Lent. That might be coffee, chocolate, junk food, or one of those little treasures that we genuinely enjoy. It might be simply cutting back our TV viewing in the evening from two hours to one hour, for example. Or something similar if video games are your thing for entertainment. **So, why do we fast?** I propose a couple of reasons that might be helpful for reflection.

When we remove something from our lives, e.g., an hour of TV or facebook time, the result is that there is now room for something else. If you are a student, that might mean you have extra time to spend on a subject that you struggle with. As a an adult you may all of the sudden find the time you were looking for to take care of some duties around the home, or your man cave, that you have been putting off because of time constraints. At the end of the day, you have given up something good, that has allowed you to embark on an opportunity to do perhaps a greater good. From a spiritual perspective, we think of fasting as giving up something good for the greater good. The greater good, of course, is the person of Jesus Christ.

What about the prayer we spoke about at the beginning of our reflection? Do you have a standard prayer regime that you follow on a daily basis? Is this the opportunity to now *up your game* a wee bit? It does not have to be large or spectacular. Some extra Hail Marys dedicated to perhaps another area of need of which you are aware. This is a great way to gradually increase, over time, the amount of time you spend with our Lord Jesus, the giver of all that is good.

Father Jim's Message

Fasting is not limited to abstaining from a physical entity, though it is a good visual place to start. What about fasting from fear? There are many things in our world that can cause us anxiousness and trepidation, yet it is the Lord who walks with us our journey. "If God is for us, who is against us?" (Rom 8, 31) We know this intellectually, but we are not that good at living it some days. I often think when I read that Scripture, "If God is for us, who is against us," that we should include, "and for that matter what does it matter who is against us? We have God on our side."

From a personal and spiritual growth perspective, what about fasting from judging others? Most of us would acknowledge that we are fairly good at judging the actions and intentions of others. Perhaps we are not so proficient in our own back yard in these areas. Remember our goal here: *I want to be a better person at the end of my Lenten journey, than I was at the beginning of Lent.* We are not striving for perfection, we are striving to become better versions of who God has created us to be. I offer this, because we may have a tendency to say, "I don't think I can ever stop judging others, so I do not even want to try." My friends, remember, we are going for gradual improvement on our spiritual journey over many, many years. The way we grow is by naming our area of concern and then taking concrete actions to accomplish it to the best of our imperfect human abilities. If you are fasting from something,

and you fall short one day or two days or three days, recognize that tomorrow is another day. Start over. It is all good. Our Lord knows our hearts my friends. He knows we will not be perfect, but He needs to know that we are trying.

If you have decided to do something that is causing you some distress, missing that morning cup of coffee, offer it up as a sacrifice for those you love, for those who need prayer. You create a double whammy this way. You are doing something that is good for you and you are "willing the good of the other," the very definition of love. That my friends, is what the Christian journey is all about; To love others as our Lord Jesus loves us. Next week we can speak about <u>almsgiving</u>.
