Father Jim's Message

"Created for Communion in Communion"

A truth of our human condition that has been strongly reaffirmed to me during this Holy of Holy Weeks is this:

For the most part, we have been saying that covid (and all that this word entails) is in the rear-view mirror. This may be more hopeful thinking than a true statement. However, it has been truly gratifying to see the large numbers of the faithful who have been gathering for our Holy Week celebrations. Hence, one of the truths of our humanity and our faith: God made us to be people of relationship, to be in communion with one another. The friendly smiles, the large crowds, that have entered OLPH in these days, really is an affirmation of who our Lord made us to be.



In a world where "its all about me" is the prevailing or dominant secular message, the isolation that we endured for the common good, had a cumulative negative effect on the psyches of humanity as a whole. It matters not whether we agree on what got us to where we are. I daresay most of us can agree that there has been a not insignificant fracture, in the way many relationships today are lived out. My friends, this is not a message of doom and gloom. It is a joyful reflection on how gratifying and rewarding it is for us to gather again in community in the way that our Lord intended, within His divine plan of creative genius.

The Stations of the Cross hosted by different ministry groups throughout Lent were exceptionally well attended and very well presented by the host groups. Our weekday morning Masses have averaged 60-70 attendees on a daily basis. Our evening Masses are gathering a consistent number of attendees as well. As expected, Passion (Palm) Sunday Masses were large and joyful gatherings of pilgrims, beginning their journey of Holy Week. In the big picture of salvation history, Holy Week is a wonderful time to enter into the salvific triumphal journey of our Lord Jesus into Jerusalem, culminating in his death on the cross. The reality of His resurrection is what made Jesus the Christ totally unique from any deity of any other faith.

In the betrayal of Jesus by Judas Iscariot and even the denial Jesus by Peter (the first Bishop of Rome), we see how the evil one continues to try and divide even the inner circle of Jesus. There has been much that has been divisive among us in the past few years, but my friends, the Beauty, the Good and the True (the immutable transcendentals), will always prevail in the person of Jesus Christ. Yes, evil would cause division, but the resurrection of our Lord, followed by the outpouring of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, formed a unity among this new Christian community that could not be diminished or exploited. This, despite the numerous external and internal challenges the Church has experienced over the past two thousand years. On a micro level, I see a very similar scenario here in the Archdiocese of Edmonton, and specifically here in our parish Churches of Our Lady of Perpetual Help and St. Francis of Assisi, Tofield.

Within the walls of our OLPH parish, along with a local and a world wide web outreach, there are an incredible number of opportunities for us to gather in person, or virtually, to live, learn, and practice our faith.

Father Jim's Message

At a very basic, practical, local level, which was my inspiration for the theme of this reflection, is the consistently larger number of smiling parishioners coming through our parish doors to celebrate the Holy Mass together. A simple, but significant example of this? On Saturday April 1, our OLPH Day of Confessions, we had four priests at a time, hearing confessions for eight continuous hours. What made this Day of Confessions unique, in my view, is that there was no break in the action for any of the priests hearing confessions. There were always many people in the Church during the day. It was a beautiful thing to behold and to be part of. If you look at the day another way, one could say this: Confessions were heard for thirty-two hours without a break.

My friends, our Lord made us to be in relationship with Him, and with one another. These God-given proclivities, lived out, are what make our lives joyful in the here and now. Together (in communion), we can celebrate the many blessings and graces of God's goodness in our lives. We can also, together (in communion), prevail over any of the challenges that are part of what it is to be fully human and fully in communion. May our Risen Lord bless you and yours this Easter Triduum with a deeper understanding and acceptance of His love for each of us His children. My friends, my Easter challenge to each of you: Invite a friend who has been away, for a short while or for a long while, to come and join our celebrations with a whole bunch of like-minded Catholic Christian folks. It is a joyful thing to celebrate the love of God together. Why? Because we have been "Created for Communion in Communion."
