



What am I Grateful for?

This is a question we should ask ourselves to begin our day, and it is one that should finish our day. We know that all that is good comes from the Lord, including the challenges. So, to strengthen and grow in our relationship with the Lord, we need to focus on gratitude for blessings given to us. Our relationship with God is no different than our relationships with other important people in our lives. We love them, and when we focus on why we love them, that simply amplifies our feelings for them. For me, I am incredibly grateful for my vocation to the priesthood. I pray that many of you are very grateful for your vocation, of marriage in particular. When I ponder what God has done for me in my life, it is difficult for me to comprehend. God knows who I am, I know who I am,

who woulda thunk? I am immensely grateful for what God has done for me in my life. Because like you, I know I don't deserve the many graces given me. We receive them not because we deserve them, but because we are loved, beyond anything we can imagine.

On a more local and relatable note, this weekend I offer two gifts that I am very grateful for. **One**, **on this Mothers Day weekend I give thanks for our Blessed Mother, for all Mothers and for my dear Mom, God rest her.** My mom was a wonderful model of what humble faith, devotion, and service can accomplish. Mom and Dad raised seven children, all born within a ten-year age span. Not an easy task in any day and age. But she did not do it alone. Mom and Dad were united as a team, and they knew that God was an important part of the equation. I do not recall ever missing a Sunday Mass, though I am sure I did. Church and prayer were as important as the seven lunches she prepared faithfully every school day of the year. Mom was the one who challenged me at an important point in my life. At a time when I was carrying around a badly broken heart, Mom was the one who said to me; "Jim, maybe God is calling you to something else." I knew exactly what she meant because I had pondered this myself. However, in my "know it all" type of wisdom, I had dismissed the idea of the priesthood because I knew better. Once my dear Mom had said it our loud, I knew I had to, in a real way, discern the vocation of the priesthood and here we are my friends, *who woulda thunk?*

Two, I am grateful for Catholic education in all its formats. We in Alberta are blessed with the gift of publicly funded Catholic Education. The publicly funded part is in large part a great gift, but also presents challenges. This, simply in virtue of balancing the teaching of the Catholic Church (master # 1)with the curriculum requirements set forth by the Government (master # 2) who funds our Catholic school system. That said, I am enormously grateful for the ten Catholic schools that we at OLPH parish are blessed to serve, and to collaborate with, in a beautiful reciprocating relationship. As a priest and as parents, we know the im-

portance of our children. We also know how important a strong relationship with God is for them; and how that well formed, faith-based relationship with God becomes the basis for how they will live their lives. Our Catholic school system serves to assist and augment the Catholic formation that we know is the primary responsibility of our parents. Our schools and our Church are in a wonderful position to assist our children in knowing that **they are loved by God**. This simple message is paramount to a strong, healthy, well-balanced view of self and of others throughout our lives.

For me the gift of our Catholic schools is this: We know very well that not all our Catholic children are at Mass on Sunday morning. But by golly, we certainly know where they are on Monday morning! The clergy at OLPH are scheduled for classroom visits with our ten schools for about an hour each week. We are scheduled by the school for which grades we will visit each week on a class-by-class basis. When the children come with their parents for Mass, or for sacramental preparation, we already have the beginning of a good healthy relationship with our young people. This is an incredibly practical way for us to build relationships with our young people of all ages. No, we may not get to know them all by name, but they all get to know us by name, and that is far more important than one might imagine. This open and organized access to build relationships with our young people is one that would not have been possible without our publicly funded Catholic Schools. Our Principals, Administration, and Teaching staff make us feel very welcome and comfortable, as do our students. Our schools are the ideal place to build relationships with the Catholic leaders of the future. We talk about the importance of the relationship between home, parish, and school. This relationship cannot be overstated. We are all in this together, and the well-being and formation of our children are the primary focus of all our efforts. I am grateful for our Catholic schools. For me as a priest, they are the vineyard where I am welcomed to enter and cultivate and nourish those beautiful young minds with the message that they are truly loved by our Lord. This critical messaging is what will assist these young people to live happy, healthy, and holy lives. Our schools are an important venue for our clergy to assist in delivering the message of God's love for them.

I am grateful for many things. Mothers Day and Catholic Education are two that top my list of things I am grateful for. Blessings, $\exists_{\alpha}, \forall_{\omega}$
