

#### FROM THE STOR'S DESK "Let the Little Children come to Me" (Mk 10, 14)

I am not sure if our parishioners have a sense of what our clergy do in a day to keep busy. Many of our parishioners only see Father once a week for an hour, so what does he do for the rest of the week? Does he sit in his office and wait for the phone to ring? No, that is not the case. Besides being available for weddings, baptisms, funerals (and the planning that goes along with each of these sacraments), there are often people looking for advice in different areas of their lives. We have six seniors' residences where we presently celebrate Mass at least twice a month, and in one

case on a weekly basis. We celebrate two Masses a day here in the parish; morning and evening, with reconciliation available after all weekday Masses. On the weekend we have five Sunday Masses; one on Saturday evening and four on Sunday. We also serve St. Francis Parish in Tofield with Mass at 11:00 am every Sunday morning. My reason for sharing this information is not to try and impress you about how busy your clergy are. It is to say, this is part of what we do. The other significant commitment we have is to our ten schools, *our OLPH family of schools*, within the Elk Island Catholic School District.

It has long been my view that our schools are the vineyard. We the clergy, along with our parents, our staff, and admin in our schools, are the laborers in the vineyard. I say this, because we know well that not all our children are at Mass on Sunday morning, but we know well where they will be on Monday morning. At the end of the day, the most important thing we can do with our young people is build relationships with them. Whether it is parents, teachers, or clergy, when you have a relationship with a young person, great things can happen. Meaning, when you have a relationship with young people, or anyone else for that matter, you have great potential to accomplish wonderful things. When you have a good relationship with someone, they tend to listen when you are communicating with them. The only way to grow a relationship is by spending time working at that relationship.

To develop relationships with our young people, the clergy here at OLPH are committed to having a clergy in every school at a scheduled time every week for classroom visits. This means we visit our ten schools weekly and might be in two or three classrooms per visit. Over the course of the school year, as you might imagine, this gives us good exposure to many students and the staff responsible for forming them. Even if we do not get to their classroom, they see us in the hallways and that is another opportunity to build relationships. This is not a bulletproof system, and it is not perfect in its concept. However, the consistently scheduled visits over time, is a very productive way of getting to know our young people, at least by face if not by name. This is a time consuming and yes at times painstaking process. But it is very much worth it, to have young people acknowledge who you are, and engage in conversation with you.

The other great benefit we have with this mode of school/parish relationship is that we

get to know our teachers, staff, and administrators very well over time. Building strong relationships with our teachers and admin is equally important, as they are the gateways to the vineyard. They are the ones who will come up with initiatives, and ideas that will assist everyone in growing. I have been feeling like we have been very busy over the last two weeks or so. As I look back at my calendar, it is evident that we have. I wish to share with you the last couple weeks of our school interaction. This on top of our regular ministry and those weekly classroom visits. It is for me, an impressive body of work.

We begin with Sunday May 28 when we celebrated the Grad Mass for ABJ at the Edmonton Convention Center. This is notable because, it is only the second time we have done it. It involved two thousand parents, grads, and family members. June 2 we celebrated the Holy Redeemer grade 8 farewell Mass at Holy Redeemer School. June 8 was a banner day, as we celebrated Mass for Archbishop Jordan High School, as well as Madonna Catholic School, outdoors at the Emerald Hills football stadium. Again, unique, as this in only the second time we have done it. More importantly it is the only local venue large enough to celebrate Mass for sixteen hundred young people. (Normally for ABJ celebrations, we have two Masses in the gym, splitting the school population in half, which is not ideal. It is however, the only way to get all the kids to Mass. Bussing them to the Church would be logistically and economically untenable.) On the same day we hosted Austin O'Brien High School for their grad Mass and commencements at OLPH. Fourteen hundred plus folks on a very warm evening. A beautiful event and relationship builder, but a very big day. The next morning the entire St. Theresa Middle School came to the parish for Mass. Yesterday St. Nicholas School came to the parish for Mass, and as I write this I know that today, Friday June 16, Holy Spirit School will be here at 10:00 am, St. Luke School will be here at 1:00 pm and OLPH School will be here for their grade 8 farewell Mass at 4:00 pm. This is in combination with 120 young people being confirmed over the last two Sundays and seventy or so young people receiving their first Holy Communion at this weekend's Masses.

As I write this, I feel like I am bragging. The reality is that I am joyfully celebrating the wonderful relationships we have with our schools. There is an economic cost to bus several hundred children to Mass, but our school Administration see this as an important component of the faith formation of our children. I see these wonderful things happening because of consistent relationship building with our children and our schools over several years. Children do not need to know you are their best friend. They do need to know that you value them and want to spend time with them. There are many moving parts in this equation. Natalie, our school liaison person, connects the dots and communicates well with our schools, and we the clergy are very happy to simply show up and engage, wherever it is we are invited to build relationships.

Yes, we do only work one hour a week, but we do manage to pack a lot into that hour. God's blessings,  $\Im_{\alpha}$ ,  $\Im_{\alpha}$
