

Did you attend Mass last Saturday evening or Sunday morning? No, I am not taking attendance. If you are reading this, there is a pretty good chance that you did. And if you did, you would have witnessed what I affectionately refer to as *reverse evangelization*. Last week we had seventy-three young people receive their First Holy Communion, spread across four of our five Sunday Masses. This group of *First Communion Kids* was the third cohort that re-

ceived their sacraments this year. In total, one hundred and seventy young people celebrated their First Reconciliation and First Eucharist within the three preparation sessions held this school year.

The reason for this writing is not to talk about numbers. It is to take notice of something very beautiful that transpired last weekend: the example our young people gave all of us, as they received Jesus for the first time. It is my prayer that your view of these little ones receiving Jesus was as good as mine was. Keep in mind most of them are around eight years old. They came forward with their hands in a prayerful position, they bowed, and then they received Jesus. Following their reception of our Lord, many of them very reverently stood in place and made the sign of the cross before going back to their pews. I found the example of these little ones to be quite profound. I am not negating the reverence with which us adults receive Jesus; but I can say that the little ones have us beat hands down, for reverence and deliberate prayerful posture. It literally touched my heart the way some of these children received Jesus. Yes I know this may not last, but I can tell you, it made a lasting impression on me. What do the little ones bring to the table that we adults do not? They bring absolute trust, faith, and unconditional love that fills their hearts. They are happy to share that love wherever, whenever, with whoever. That is what made this experience so powerful. Young beautiful, trusting, loving faith-filled youngsters receiving their Lord and Saviour for the first time. WOW.

I referred to reverse evangelization. Most of us would say that we, the adults, need to evangelize our children, in order to assist them on their journeys to the Promised Land. Well, I don't know about you, but I was evangelized last weekend by our First Communion children. They were dressed in their Sunday best for Jesus. They did not need to be told to

be quiet, they were ready. My friends, I am sharing my thoughts with you because it impacted me and my faith journey. If you had a good view of what was happening, I am sure it impacted your faith journey as well. Miss Natalie and her very capable sacramental preparation team prepared our children, in collaboration with their parents and teachers, very, very well.

One of the things that has worked well over the past three years (for Confirmation prep, as well as the younger age group), has been the requirement that parents attend preparation sessions with their children, and the sessions begin with Mass. This is important, because it opens the doors of the Church to our parents as well as our children. Sometimes, if we have become disconnected from the parish for covid or whatever reason, we find it challenging to reconnect. Our sacramental preparation program has worked extremely well, for over three hundred of our young families this year alone, as a conduit and welcoming invitation to them.

God indeed, does work in mysterious ways, there is no doubt. He does indeed speak to us through some very interesting people. Last weekend we had the opportunity to encounter the Lord in the reverence and holy beauty of our young first communicants. May our Lord bless us all with the gift of awareness, attentiveness, and openness to God's action in the world. Even when it comes to us from those we might least expect. Thank you young people. You are indeed a precious God-given gift to all of us.
