

# "For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven... (Ecc. 3, 1)."

Perhaps it was the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, or the reality that our parish is simply going to be very busy this month - with end of year school Masses, graduations etc. - but it became evident to me that *it is time*. As we concluded the month of Mary and prepared for the June rush, I consulted with some of our stakeholders and it became evident to me that now is the time to remove the mask mandate for Extra-ordinary Ministers of Communion, Adult Servers, and Clergy. They will be welcome, however, according to the comfort level of the minister involved.

Our philosophy, as we have evolved out of the rollercoaster of the past three years, is to provide those who are concerned about the spread of germs etc. with a clear signal that we are concerned about them and about the overall health of our parish. The masks worn were meant to give those receiving Holy Communion peace, that OLPH was doing all that is possible to keep her faithful safe. Yet at what point is enough, enough? We have been living the new normal now for over a year and things seem to be going well within our society healthwise. We are still required to mask up when we enter Alberta Health Services and Covenant Health facilities. I dare say that we have not been over scrupulous in the precautionary department. (Though some might disagree, and that is their right.)

The other process we will end at this time is the sanitization of the pews after the Masses. I am deeply grateful to those of you who have so faithfully continued the cleaning process throughout this prolonged period of time. What we will do going forward is ask our custodian Lito, to do a sanitizing clean on Monday mornings after the weekend rush.

What we will continue to offer, and I do see this as the way forward in the future is the following: Our greeters will continue to offer the opportunity for you to sanitize your hands if you choose when you arrive and when you leave the Church. This is simply a courtesy and an invitation, but it does send a message that we are supportive of a hygienic worship space. Our Clergy and other Eucharistic Ministers will continue to sanitize their hands after receiving Holy Communion themselves, mask or no mask.

I am profoundly grateful to you dear volunteers within our parish who stepped up and served where needed, and did what was called for, over an extended period. Thank you for your dedication and commitment to providing an environment that the faithful knew was conducive to healthy worship. All our pre-covid folks are not back in the parish yet. At this

point though I do not think that a safe worship space environment is the reason our parishioners are not back in the pews. At a talk I gave on Thursday evening, I was introduced as the pastor of a parish with six thousand families. I had to smile to myself about that. If even two thirds of our families attended Sunday worship regularly, we would need to build another Church! I do live in hope, and I do have the energy to build another Church. So please my friends, whatever your reason or thinking for not being here, please come back. The Lord Jesus misses you, and we miss you. We are working diligently at being the most welcoming parish in the Archdiocese of Edmonton.

The livestreaming and television airing (Ch 877 Telus) that we continue to do, is meant to serve the faithful who are <u>not able</u> to attend Mass on Sunday morning, due to health, mobility, and transportation challenges. We are aware that it can become comfortable to simply join the Holy Mass on Sunday Morning by way of livestream or channel 877. If you are ill or of advanced age, or transportation is the challenge, welcome to our virtual Masses. Be aware please, that if you are joining the Mass from home because of convenience, though that is an implicit good, it does not cover your Sunday obligation. The dispensation from the Sunday obligation was lifted a year ago on Pentecost Sunday. The Church is still the right and normal place of worship to fulfill our Sunday obligation. In the same breath, I take this opportunity to remind you that summer may be a time where we slow down and are not so caught up in the busy-ness of the school year. Please make the Holy Mass a part of your summer programming for your family. Young or not so young, the consistency of year-round attendance develops habits and discipline in your children that will pay off down the road.

My friends, God created us in His image and likeness, and we are hardwired to be in relationship with one another. When we come together on Sunday morning, we grow as a community of faith, and we support one another on our individual journeys of relationship with God, with one another and with ourselves. It is a great gift to come together in community and grow in that way, while at the same time receiving the grace

of the sacraments that will support us in the week to come. Folks, God's grace is absolutely real, and absolutely efficacious, in it's benefits upon us. And your parish Church is absolutely the place to come and receive both these gifts, freely, abundantly, and lavishly.
