
Together, young and old, let us be protagonists of generosity in our world and witnesses to the love of Christ, a love that is both fruitful and supportive.





# And now you know the rest of the story.

Some of you will remember that this is how Paul Harvey, a popular radio personality of a past era (now deceased), would end his commentaries. Mr. Harvey would pick a story that people had heard about in the media, but little was known about the story, other than perhaps the headline. Paul Harvey would do some very diligent and interesting research on this person or event and then present a much more detailed account of what had transpired to make the story newsworthy. He would always finish his monologue with his famous one liner: "And now you know the rest of the story." It was always well done, and always informative.

I would like to comment this day on a part of our parish life that few of us know much about. (Yet we have an innate appreciation for the Time, Talent and Treasure that goes into these areas.) I can say with an amount of healthy pride, that our Liturgies are reverent and lifegiving. Yes, there is always room for growth for sure; but it is reasonable to say, that we at Our Lady of Perpetual Help celebrate the Holy Mass in a worthy and reverent way. We know this Mass is available to people throughout the world, seven days a week, at 8:30 a.m. by way of livestream, and throughout the province on Telus channel 877. This is the part of the story that we see: many of our faithful parishioners adult serving, Eucharistic ministering, altar serving, proclaiming, singing, playing, ushering, audio videoing, and welcoming. Thank you dear friends for what you are doing and thank you to those who are responding to the invitation to step up, and step in, to ministry. It does indeed take a village to celebrate the Holy Mass, and we are a healthy, engaged village for sure, always with potential to grow.

The area of ministry I want to address today is that of our **unsung heroes**. It is human nature to take things for granted, simply because we are accustomed to seeing them in a certain way. I invite you to think for a moment about several scenarios. When you arrive at our exceptionally large parking lot, winter or summer, it is always accessible, clear of snow and debris. The sidewalks are always clear of snow. When you park and make your way toward the Church you will note that the grass is always well groomed and looking sharp. Our gardens we have by the parish office, and inside the office entry, are always well maintained. Then we walk into our Church itself, with its immense amount of carpet and floor area. This vast area is always vacuumed and clean. The floors in the foyer are always shiny and clean. Our Church nave is always beautifully appointed with flowers, and other creative and attractive seasonal decorations.

My friends, I know you are aware, these things do not happen by accident. We have so many unsung heroes, who work in a coordinated way as teams of volunteers, keeping our parish and our grounds incredibly beautiful. Last Monday after the morning Mass, there were at least four angels with vacuums going full throttle between all the pews and surrounding carpeted area. Last Saturday, one of our outdoor maintenance fellows was doing wonderful work

in cutting the grass on the parish grounds, in preparation for our Sunday celebrations. This is a significant amount of green space to maintain. Our team of outdoor volunteers take this mission very seriously. Perish the thought, but in the winter, when you show up on a snowy Sunday morning for an early Mass, the walks will be clean, and the parking lot is accessible and manageable. I am not a horticulturist, but I do know that gardens do not weed and water themselves. It is seldom that you will see a light burnt out for more than a day or so, as our maintenance committee is very much proactive in the day-to-day housekeeping of this exceptionally large house. Not to mention, the dear, selfless souls who wash and iron the many linens that we use in the celebration of the Holy Mass.

So many things happen behind the scenes, inside and outside, in preparation for our Liturgies. There are as many volunteers behind the scenes, as those you will see serving in various capacities on Sunday morning. My friends, it is with heartfelt gratitude that I thank you all on behalf of all the faithful at Our Lady of Perpetual Help parish. Thank you Unsung Heroes, thank you Front line volunteers. It does indeed take a village to celebrate the Holy Mass at OLPH.

And now you know the *rest* of the story.






