




17th Sunday of Ordinary Time - Have we discovered the gift of God? Are we ready to share and spread this amazing news to others?

"Father, I desire that they all may be one, (Jn. 17, 21)."

One of the understandings of the definition of "Catholic" is "universal." I note this because this defines our Church, the "One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church." The Church instituted by Jesus Christ Himself (Holy), universal (Catholic), founded on Apostolic succession with papal lineage traceable to the time of Peter (Apostolic). One of the elements that makes our Church beautiful is the *universal* component of the Catholic Church. Yes, there are dogmas that are non-negotiable: the Trinity, the humanity and divinity of Jesus, Mary the Mother of God, the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. If I profess to be Catholic, I need to accept these truths in faith, even though I do not have the intellectual capacity to fully comprehend them.

My point about the universality of our Catholic Church revolves around her inclusiveness. All our welcome. You are reading this and saying, what about those who are living outside of Church teaching? Friends make no mistake, all are welcome in the Church. If one finds themselves in a state of grave sin, they may not be in a situation where they can receive Holy Communion, but they are always welcome in the Church. Keep in mind that you and I, if we find ourselves in a state of grave sin, we are not eligible to receive Holy Communion either, until we are Reconciled with God. So, the playing field is level, for one and for all. However, that is not the universality that I am speaking of this day. I am speaking of the age demographic that the Church engages and celebrates.

What brought me to this thought process is that last Sunday, July 23, was the third annual celebration of grandparents and the elderly. Pope Francis promulgated this celebration himself, and I believe this to be a beautiful reflection on a large part of who the Church is. This week pilgrims, young adults 18-35 years of age, began to converge on Lisbon, Portugal for World Youth Day. A few weeks prior to this, and throughout the past year, parishioners of St. Francis, Tofield, and Our Lady of Perpetual Help showed remarkable zeal; supporting fundraisers that assisted our young adults to get to Portugal. Many of our young people from the Archdiocese are journeying to Portugal as we speak for "Days in the Dioceses", the gathering that precedes World Youth Day, in 17 dioceses across mainland Portugal and the islands. World Youth Day will culminate with hundreds of thousands of young people from around the world celebrating the Holy Mass with Pope Francis. WOW.

In the middle of this past week, ten thousand plus Indigenous pilgrims from all over

Canada assembled at Lac St. Anne for the annual healing pilgrimage, on the one-year anniversary of Pope Francis's historic Reconciliation visit to Canada. We celebrated the elderly last week, this week we celebrate our young people of the world, and throughout the week we have been celebrating pilgrims of every age attending Lac St. Anne to pray, to heal, and to celebrate their faith.

My friends, our "One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church" is indeed universal in her nature, and there is a vast amount of room in her for all of God's children, young and not so young. For me, this sends a clear signal that our Lord's all-encompassing love extends to all people of all ages. I do not much believe in coincidence, but I do believe in God's providence. Here we are in the middle of a sizzling summer; dealing with wildfires, heat, and even flooding, depending where in the country one lives. Yet amid all this, the work of our Lord and our Church continues, evangelizing by word and example, people of all ages, of all time and all places. Thank you dear Lord for your universal love for your universal Church.
