National Day for Truth and Reconciliation

"For over a century, the central goals of Canada's Aboriginal policy were to eliminate Aboriginal governments; ignore Aboriginal rights; terminate the Treaties; and, through a process of assimilation, cause Aboriginal peoples to cease to exist as distinct legal, social, cultural, religious, and racial entities in Canada. The establishment and operation of the residential schools were a central element of this policy, which can best be described as "cultural genocide." (#1 TRC Honoring the Truth, Reconciling for the Future 2015).


This is the opening paragraph of the Truth and Reconciliation Executive Summary document, "Honoring the Truth." The Truth and Reconciliation Commission listened for over six years to the stories of thousands of Indigenous people, who had lived through the experience of residential schools; or who were children or grandchildren who had experienced the "generational trauma" passed on to them by their families, because of their residential school experience. Very difficult words for us to read, difficult to own, yet as Canadians, they are our history. As Catholics, who brought the Good News of Jesus Christ, the first health care systems and structured education to this land, these words too, are part of our history.

What we may or not know is that residential schools were the brainchild of the Canadian Federal government of the time. The Catholic Church, as well as several other Christian denominations, were contracted by the government to provide education for these young indigenous children. Yes, this is a painful part of our Church's history. Yes, here we are today, the same Church, endeavoring to achieve the Truth and Reconciliation that will ultimately lead to authentic healing for so many who are in need of it.

There were 94 calls to action highlighted by the TRC, and the Holy Father's engagement and apology in this healing journey was very much a part of the call to action. It was also a clear signal to all Catholics, that we need to do what we can to participate in the healing and Reconciliation, that is so clearly needed.

"Listening to your voices, I was able to enter into, and be deeply grieved by the stories of the suffering, hardship, discrimination, and various forms of abuse that some of you experienced, particularly in the residential schools...I ask for God's forgiveness, and I want to say to you with all my heart: I am very sorry. And I join my brothers, the Canadian bishops, in asking your pardon."

These words were spoken by Pope Francis at Maskwacis last July as he met with them on their land and asked forgiveness on behalf of the Catholic Church. That is where it needs to begin; with contrition for past wrongs, regardless whether I was actually part of the process. Original sin is an integral part of the human condition, passed on to us from those we refer to as our first parents. In the same way, we carry a culpability for the wrongs of those who came before us. We need to do what we can, moving forward, to initiate healthy and authentic reconciliation and healing.







brothers were here first. I do not know the minds of our forefathers. They may well have believed they were doing our First People a favor by teaching them the Western Way. I am absolutely certain that the vast majority of faithful religious men and women who taught them, did so with pure and God-centered hearts. Many, many very good, faithful, God-fearing men and women religious, gave their entire lives in the service of our Indigenous brothers and sisters. Their only goal was the well-being of the children they were responsible to educate. It is clear now that this was not the appropriate mode of effecting communion between the First People and those who arrived before we did.

September 30 is the National Day of Truth and Reconciliation in Canada. At Parish Pastoral Council we have been grappling with how a community like Sherwood Park, a parish with the demographic of Our Lady of Perpetual Help, can come to a greater awareness of Truth and Reconciliation. How can we participate in the healing that is so needed. One of the maxims of the First People on this journey has been "Nothing about us without us." We need the counsel of our Indigenous brothers and sisters to help us know how to move forward on the journey of healing, in an authentic and participatory way. Our PPC are reaching out to Elk Island Catholic Schools, who already work closely with Indigenous elders and knowledge keepers in our school system. Our hope is to invite them to assist/counsel us in our next moves.

Something that is clear to me, that we do not need advice on, is this: We all have an obligation to understand objectively what has happened in the past. This, so we can understand that we need a path forward for a healthy reconciled future. Each of us should take a read through the 94 calls to action that came about through the work of the TRC Commission. Here is the link to the National Truth and Reconciliation Center website, https://nctr.ca/records/reports/. If you are a reader, there is no shortage of chronological documentation from the last hundred plus years. However, you go about it, we need to make ourselves more aware of the need for reconciliation with our First People. They too are God's children and that makes them our sisters and brothers in the Lord. My friends, this is a difficult, controversial and at times polarizing topic. Challenging as it may be, the only way we will make positive progress, is by becoming conversant on topic of Truth and Reconciliation. Please do explore and inform yourselves as you are able. Please do pray for an open heart and mind as you go about this essential journey. We will keep you informed of upcoming awareness opportunities moving forward.
