





The Wells of Salvation that give us Life and Joy on the Desert Journey (Is. 12, 3)

This is the title of the retreat that Emeritus Cardinal Thomas Collins has been sharing with us this week at our annual clergy retreat. You are all aware that His Eminence Cardinal Collins was Bishop of St. Paul from 1997-1999. He served as the Archbishop of Edmonton from 1999-2006, prior to his appointment as Archbishop of Toronto in 2007. He has only recently retired at the ripe age of seventy-five years plus, and graciously accepted Archbishop Smith's invitation to preach at a retreat for the priests of this Archdiocese. It has been a joyful reunion, as Cardinal Collins knows personally a good number of our Diocesan clergy. He has confirmed some of our younger priests, and ordained some of our older priests such as myself.

Cardinal Collins's theme of this retreat revolves around the challenges that we as clergy, and of course we as lay people, can experience on our life journeys through, what at times, can be seem to be very much desert-like. His view of course, is that Christians have always been on a desert journey back to the time of God's people on their Exodus journey from Egypt toward the Promised Land. All this to say, that our God has always accompanied His people through the good times and the times of challenge. "Our retreat is intended to highlight familiar wells of salvation from which we can draw life and joy as we journey through this world, homeward bound."

As an outcome of their busy ministry, clergy can at times find themselves in a very arid and dry place, and perhaps not be aware of where the "wells of salvation" occur for our refreshment and rejuvenation on our life journey. Cardinal Collins has broken our retreat into eight different sessions all focusing on different wells of salvation on our desert journey. I offer the following titles to his sessions: 1. Oasis on the Desert Journey 2. Sabbath Time 3. Penitence 4. Prayer without Ceasing 5. Lectio and Lectio Divina 6. The Divine Office 7. Perspective: Apocalyptic and Historical 8. The Holy Sacrifice.

As I write this, we are only at the half way mark of our sessions. What I can say is that Cardinal Collins has been a joy to listen to. He is so zealous and animated in his presentations. More than that, he is so knowledgeable that it is challenging for him to stay on point (though he always does.) He is so well read and so versed in the topical matter that no matter what point he is making, up pops a personal story illustrating his perspective. It is really quite amazing to listen to him because of his breadth of knowledge in so many different

areas. And he does it with Panache! With joy, with different voices and postures, moving from pop culture to ancient history, often in the same thought wave. It has been a gift to listen and learn this week. Fr. Ben and I both thank the good people of OLPH for making this possible for us.

Cardinal Collins has always, by his own admission, been a voracious reader, with history being one of his primary interests. His sharing, and the broad scope of that sharing, has most of us in a kind of awe wondering what is coming next. But at the end of the day, his stated goal is this: To remind us clergy of the wells of salvation from which we can draw life and joy in our ministerial priesthood. Our priesthood that is not ours, but that of Jesus Christ. Our priesthood which we are blessed with, solely for the purpose of walking with God's faithful to Promised Land. The Promised Land that we all aspire to arrive at, when the good Lord calls us home (as we know at one point He will.) Until then, we put one foot in front of the other on a daily basis, trusting that our God who is always faithful walks with us every step of our journey. Thank you, Cardinal Collins; for your priesthood, for your Episcopal leadership, and your fifty years plus in priestly service of the Lord and His people. We, the clergy of the Archdiocese, have been blessed this week, with your sharing of your love of God and your priesthood with us.
