

- 5. Yay! Today is Potluck! Hope you brought your appetites!



How is your memory? Sorry to hear that. Tee Hee. The end of August and beginning of September has signaled back to school for time immemorial. How many of you have fond and exciting memories of the first day back at school? I believe most of us do. Particularly as we grew old enough to appreciate our friends that we had missed throughout the summer. Keep in mind, I am speaking now about the last century or so, not the last two decades where young people can stay in contact all summer with their friends via face time, zoom, and whatever the latest social platform of the week is. Back in the day, unless your classmates lived close by, you might not see them all summer. You might see them on Sunday at Church, or you might not. Regardless of the circumstances, last century or this week, it was always an exciting time of anticipation and looking forward to seeing our classmates, coupled with the thoughts of new and interesting experiences yet to be enjoyed.

This week, I had the pleasure of being part of two opening school year Masses for two Catholic school divisions. On Tuesday, we hosted the Elk Island Catholic School District Mass here at Our Lady of Perpetual Help parish. We were privy to beautiful, joyful music from the Holy Spirit School choir, and to a top notch - inviting yet challenging - homily from His Grace, Archbishop Richard Smith, who presided at this Mass. On Thursday, I presided at one of four Edmonton Catholic Schools Masses at Corpus Christi parish. It was wonderful to be back in South Edmonton and greet so many familiar faces of educators I had gotten to know in my nine years in Mill Woods. On both occasions we experienced about one thousand participants in the Holy Mass.

My observations are thus. In both scenarios, the educators who are responsible for the formation of our young people could very well have been confused with the young people they teach. There was such a buzz of excitement amongst these joyful adults, as they greeted colleagues and friends whom they may not have seen all summer. These big kids were behaving very much like little kids, with their unbridled excitement, and sharing with one another what they had been up to during the summer past. It was an enjoyable scenario to observe from a bit of a distance. The volume of voices, the bigness of the smiles and the loudness of the laughter was really a very enjoyable experience to witness and to be part of.

Why am I focusing on the first day of school for our teachers? Because in so many ways, your first days of school that I asked you to remember, and our teachers first days of school, expresses very clearly, one aspect of God's creative genius. God created us in His image and likeness, in His divine image He created us. But the key to this creative wonder is that God made us as people to be in relationship. Relationship with Him, with ourselves, and with each other. The poignancy of this genius is exacerbated and amplified when we witness a large group of social beings, gathered for the first time, after a long time apart. We miss each other, we need each other, we like each other. That is the beauty of how our

Lord made us. This is one of the key components of our humanity that makes life truly special, and in fact joyful. We, each of us, thrive and flourish when we are in the company of one another. If we are long time friends, spouses, family or otherwise, we are at our best when we can be with one another.

Think about elderly couples you may know, who are well into their golden years. They may not be having a boisterous, life-of-the-party conversation. They may simply be sitting beside one another on the couch reading, or even enjoying a little nap. The key is that they are happy in one another's company. They are living out their God-given lives in the company of one another. And because that is how our Lord created us to be, it does not need to high volume. It simply needs to be with one another. God said it is not good for us to be alone, so He gave us one another, which most days, is one of the greatest blessings we can possibly imagine.

As we begin this school year, in all its diverse forms and manifestations, with all its excitement and anticipation, please pray. Pray for the well being of our young people from K-12, university and beyond. Pray for our parents, our educators, administration, bus drivers and custodians. Pray for all those who, through a collaborative relationship with one another, form our young people into the faith-filled men and women that we all desire for them to become. It really does take a village to raise a child, and our prayers for them are a significant and important part of that process. Blessings and happy school year to all.
