What is Happening in the Background at Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish?

My friends, there are several wheels turning in the background here at Our Lady of Perpetual Help parish. Some of which you may be aware of and some, perhaps not.

- 1. First update: The Affordable Seniors Housing complex, proposed for the west side of our property. This dialogue is ongoing with all parties. One of the priorities for us as a parish, to move forward with this project, is to ensure that the potential for "aging in place" is the desired outcome. Our hope is that we will be able to negotiate an apartment building that has the potential to offer meal service and potential available nursing assistance at some point in the future. We recognize that most of our folks will move into the complex as independent adults and couples. We also recognize that 3-5 years from move in date, some may not feel like cooking every day and would like to have access to prepared meals as desired. If this were not possible then moving to another facility would be required, and that is not what we desire for an outcome. We want our beloved seniors to be able to age in place and to attend Mass every day, if they so desire. Please stay tuned. We believe we are not far from seeing a business plan that will respond to our stated requirements.
- 2. We have a committee who have been discerning a new flooring system for the sanctuary/ altar area of the Church. Our goal is to have the sanctuary covered with a tile of some sort, that would give it a look of nobility. The principle being that the sanctuary is the Holy of Holies within the Church. Whatever we can do to enhance that noble/holy appearance is what we are striving for.
- 3. Our roof, although it has been much better in recent years, still leaks on occasion. As long as the roof continues to leak, even if only sporadically, it makes it impossible to address the nave of the Church interior. (Particularly the flat part of our interior, where new roof tiles and paint are long overdue.) We are looking at a new roof system, after some extensive consultation, and are going forward with a (RFP) request for proposal from several roofing specialists. This will be a significant cost, but I have come to accept it is a necessary one, given that a healthy roofing system protects any interior developments that enhance the beauty of our already beautiful parish Church.
- 4. We are nearly ready to pull the trigger on some audio-visual upgrades in the parish. Not so much within the nave of the Church itself, but in the foyer and area entrances. Our plan is to have electronic screens/signage strategically placed in the foyer and office entrance areas. This, so that those who enter the Church can see which meetings are happening in which rooms. This will also enable us to roll events and videos, while folks are enjoying coffee and a visit after Mass. This project also includes a permanently installed projector and retractable projection screen in the parish hall. We host many events, not least of which are funeral lunches. This will provide a much more manageable mode of presenting AV events in the parish hall; for faith formation, sacramental preparation and as stated funeral lunches and other rental events.

- One of the mandates I was given upon beginning my service OLPH, was to research some potential land for a future Church once it was established where the next major development was to take place. We now know that Bremner is the future site of perhaps fifty thousand people, perhaps twenty-five years or longer from now. We need to be proactive in having the land available to build another Church when the need becomes a reality. We are presently in some preliminary information type discussions with local developers, to see what is available, and what resources would be needed to acquire a ten-acre parcel. Suffice to say, that even now, this will be no bargain. If we wait until the need for a Church is present and not future, we will never be able to purchase the land, never mind build a Church on it. The last two parishes built in the Archdiocese of Edmonton, Corpus Christi in southeast Edmonton (2015) and St. Francis Xavier in Camrose (2018), both cost in the range of sixteen million dollars to build. Prudence requires that we plan now, for future generations and communities.
- 6. We have revived our local in-house Maintenance Committee and will have a running "maintenance required" log at reception. We have a wonderful, talented, gifted, and energetic maintenance team! Yards, grass, snow removal and minor maintenance issues...this group saves our parish a ton of money annually, by sharing their *Time and Talent* for the upkeep of our parish community. Thank you all. If you see a repair that is required within our parish, please report it to reception, and they will ensure that it is logged and noted for repair.

Our parish is pretty much in full swing with lots of sacramental preparation, committee meetings, faith formation, worship, and various activities happening daily, most evenings until

9:00 at night. The parish office is open from 7:30 am to 7:30 pm seven days a week. There is a lot going on at OLPH parish my friends, in front of, and behind the scenes. We are back. Thank you dear Jesus.
