As I was reflecting on what to write about this week, it came to my mind, that several of our faithful parishioners had asked me if I am still their pastor at OLPH. I smiled and noted that indeed, I am still the pastor at OLPH parish. However, it did touch a chord with me, as

I am very much accustomed to being outside the doors of our parish, doing my "hostess with the mostest" thing when parishioners are entering the Church for Mass.
