





Thanksgiving ~ What are you grateful for?

In some ways, it might seem ludicrous to be asking a question like this. We would likely all agree that for the most part, we should be - and probably are - grateful every day. We do not need a special time of year to celebrate God's goodness. However, these special occasions do give us pause for reflection, because in the busyness of life, the pause for reflection does not happen often enough for many of us. I must say that focusing and reflecting on that which I am grateful for is helpful for me. Generally, I know that I am blessed, and that my Mom and my Gramma, and various other family members, are praying feverishly for me daily, from their heavenly pews. I know without question, that this is why I am able to do what I do, and love it while I am doing it.

I believe it to be true that *if you say you can or you can't, you are right*. Taking a little time to reflect, with intention, on other blessings is really a great practice for me. Mostly, because I can think of *many* blessings, which puts me in a grateful state of mind. Intentionally focusing on blessings can lead me to realize a blessing that I was perhaps not cognisant of, prior to my purposeful reflection.

I encountered what I feel is a very cool blessing in these recent days, leading up to this writing. In my school years, I played every sport I could and loved it. What I realized in those younger years, especially during high school, is that I am very competitive. My degree of competitiveness also seemed to be amplified when I was playing on a team. I think this was because it was not just about me, but I wanted our communal team to do well. I believe my competitiveness was heightened because I did not want to let my teammates down because of a shortcoming on my part. It seems winning is sweeter when one wins as a team. I am not sure of the psychology of this, but I believe it to be true.

What I have come to appreciate in recent days, is that I am once again playing on a winning team. Yes, I curl and I golf, but those are not the teams I am speaking of. I am speaking of the fact that I play on Team OLPH/St. Francis, and I very much consider us a winning team. No, we have not won it all. I think we will individually have to arrive in heaven, to know the ultimate win. I can say with certitude, that it feels like I am part of a large rowing team, and we are all rowing in more or less the same direction with our oars in the water at more or less the same time. I hope you can visualize my rowing image. We are not gliding perfectly straight, and some are stronger rowers than others, but we are definitively moving towards the finish line as a team.

As the pastor of a large parish, I encounter many opinions, ideas, practices, processes,

and possibilities. Some are quite unique, but I am convinced that we all have the same goals in mind. We all want to get ourselves to heaven, as well as the people in our lives who are important to us. We, at OLPH/St. Francis, are really, just a very large rowing team, rowing our way toward the heavenly gates. You may be reading this and thinking "Fr. Jim is a little bit out there on this one," but I disagree. It is a profound blessing to know in my heart that



the many parishioners that I interact with daily, all have the same intent. We are all rowing in the same direction. A pastor can lull themselves into a "they have their agenda and I have mine" type of thinking. That is a true statement, but though the short-term goals may be divergent, there is no question that the long-term goals are in perfect harmony. When viewed from the big picture world view, it is a great blessing to know we all desire the same thing.

"And we know that God causes all things to work together for good to those who love God, to those who are called according to His purpose, (Rom 8, 28)." Some of our faithful have expressed concern about what they are hearing, regarding the synod that is happening in Rome currently. My counsel on this is to be patient; let the process take place. These people are all rowing in the same direction as we are. They all aspire to the same destination as you and me. The best part of all this: This is God's Church, and the Holy Spirit is indeed in charge. Historically, humanity has messed things up in the past, but here we are. Wow, another incredible blessing has once again become very apparent to me. God is God and we are not.
