








Just as you welcomed the least of these, my brothers and sisters, that you did unto me. (*Mt. 25, 31*).

In my view, a key element to vibrant, welcoming, flourishing communities, are good, healthy "relationships." The most effective route to effecting a good, healthy relationship begins with the concept of welcome. In relation to our parish community, or any community, the way an individual feels as they enter the Church, will have a definitive impact on the openness of their hearts to encounter the Lord in an efficacious and grace-filled way. It is my opinion that between our ushers, our greeters and our clergy, present in the foyer prior to the Holy Mass beginning, we do a good job of presenting a welcoming atmosphere for those who enter Our Lady of Perpetual Help parish. Most days, most people, when they enter the parish should be receiving a smile and a welcome. This may not seem like much, but a smile and a welcome are indeed gifts when offered to someone, as they enter the parish, preparing to encounter the Lord.

My point is that we are getting it about half right my friends. Wouldn't it be lovely if after receiving a warm welcome and a smile; if after receiving the Lord Himself in the Holy Eucharist, as we leave the nave of the Church and enter the foyer; we could take a breath, grab a coffee, a cookie, and a visit with our neighbor about stuff like the kids, school, work, the weather. Wouldn't that be nice? If you are in a hurry to get your child to hockey with no time to stop, no problem. Grab a coffee to go. At other times, you will have a moment to catch up with a friend, or perhaps to meet that person who wished you the peace of Christ a short time earlier. Or even to decide whether you agree or disagree with what Father had to say in his homily. *(Oh yeah, I forgot. No one ever disagrees with what Father says, yeah right...)*



My friends, the next step in closing the loop in making our parish a welcoming community is to have coffee and treats available for those who would like to visit for a few minutes after Mass on Sunday. We have a great group who do exactly this on Fridays after the morning Mass. For Sundays, we lack only one thing: leaders and volunteers. We need a couple of folks to take ownership of this ministry. We will begin small, with hospitality only after the 12:30 pm Mass on Sundays. I do believe that this will take root and will become something that is desired after all our Masses soon enough. Again, we need you, ideally a small group who would captain this ministry. The volunteer servers and clean up folks will materialize once we get this going. We could even add it to signup genius, so folks could plan ahead and make a commitment on a particular Sunday. The parish is happy to cover the incidental costs, but we need a few folks who can take this on and run with it, making this ministry part of their service to the Church. When Miss Natalie serves up coffee and cake after our school events or Sacramental celebrations, we always have great participation from grateful folks.

Currently, we are well on our way to unveiling what we call a "Compassionate Parish" in the new year. This will be big, and it will assist our dear parishioners who receive difficult medical news etc., as well as those who walk their next steps with them. Exciting times ahead for this wonderful initiative. In the meantime, we need to work at continuing to grow into, what I pray people will refer to, as a "Welcoming Parish."

Please, if this concept, this ministry, appeals to your sense of service, please do contact the parish office, or me personally. I know the necessary gifts are out there in our pews. I also hope that as you are reading this, it is speaking to you as a call to action and service in your faith community. This may seem like a small thing, but in my view, it will lift our parich to the next level of welcome

ish to the next level of welcome.

These many little things we do, will add up to make OLPH a place people will tell their friends about. A place to encounter the Lord in the Holy Eucharist, and a friend over coffee and treats.
