# "That they all may be one, (Jn. 17, 21)"

I am sure you are aware that we are coming toward the end of the Church's liturgical year and making ready to begin the Advent season. The readings, within our three-year cycle, are strategically chosen by those in the know to cause us to reflect on the end times. The end of the Church liturgical year, the end of time as we know it, and the end of our time here in the world. The four last things, as taught by the Church, are: death, judgement, heaven, and hell. It is important for us to have these things within our subconscious, simply because we all know we will be called to give an account of our lives, on the day that we meet the Lord. This is not to say that we should live in fear and trembling. *Au contraire*, we need to live our lives in joyful anticipation of the time when we finally meet our creator face to face; The one who created us out of love, the one who wants only good for us, in this life and in the next. In gratitude, we live our lives in such a way that on that momentous day, we can go forth with unfathomable joy, to embrace the most glorious moment of our created existence.

No, I am not trying to sneak an end times homily into my weekly bulletin reflection. Where my thoughts did go, as I was reflecting on the end of year, the end of time etc., was to "communion." I thought about the many relationships in my life, and how I need to make sure my *relationship ducks* are in a row, while I still have the opportunity to do so. Jesus is always about Communion, about relationship, about community. The evil one, on the other hand, likes to divide. There is truth in the expression *divide and conquer*. It is not hard to look at our world and see that the evil one is having some measure of success in the divisiveness department. Some of the issues are self evident. We have two separate wars on opposite sides of the world, fighting to destroy one another. I know it is not that simple, and my intent is not to dwell, but to point out that God made us to be in communion; with Him, with one another and with ourselves.

So, we have governments fighting wars. It is unlikely that anyone really has a definitive understanding of "the why" of the war, yet we have much loss of life, and the wars continue. We have political parties in Canada, and south of the forty-ninth parallel, who are not just opposition parties to one another, but are diametrically opposed to one another. Do they know the root of why they are absolutely in contrast to one another? I would be interested to hear someone articulate how being absolutely opposed, can provide any formula for a positive outcome, for their party, or for the people they are elected to serve.

How about the society that we are part of, or even the Christian Churches that comprise remarkably close to fifty percent of the Alberta population. The tendency is to focus

our attention more on what is different, rather than the many things that we have in common. Our Christian Churches very often fail to present a united front on controversial topics. Yet, we would all say that we are all God's children. Is it possible for a divided heart to be united with Christ? Christ did not invest in communion with only those who were like Him. His was a universal call, and response, to all who came to Him.

My friends, my point: Life is too short. We need to live our lives joyfully. Truly, the only way we can be truly joyful is by loving God (which is easy to say), and loving our neighbor (which is difficult to do). In order to love our neighbor, we need to look past the differences, the things we disagree with. We need to see them as our Lord sees them, as His beloved and precious children. To see them as Jesus sees them is very challenging for sure, but my friends, we must try. If I say I genuinely love Jesus, and I do, I must love his other children to the best of my ability, as He does. For that I will need a great degree of humility, far more than I have now, but I need to ask the Lord for it. What relationships in my life do I need to invest in/fix/reconcile, to truly embrace Jesus' invitation to communion? Death, judgement, heaven, and hell. Of those four topics, my focus needs to be on what I need to do to get to heaven. I will not do it perfectly, but I know the Lord knows my heart, and that He knows your heart. My friends, life is too short. Let's make the absolute best of it while we have the God-given opportunity to do so. Let us make sure our relationship ducks are lined up nicely in a row while we have blessed time and grace-filled opportunity.
