## "Do whatever they teach you and follow it."

We have a great gift within publicly funded Catholic Education. The value of Catholic education in our schools cannot be overstated. Our homeschool systems, our distance learning facilities, all within a Catholic framework, are essential to support parents as the first educators of their children in the Catholic faith. As parents, we love our children with a love beyond all telling, there is no question about that. They are our flesh and blood, and we, out of love, want only absolutely the best for them in all things. Aside from our love for our children, the greatest gift we will ever give them is the gift of faith. I offer these thoughts on a weekend where we intentionally celebrate the gift of publicly funded Catholic education in Alberta, because this is the ambience (other than at home), where most of our children are formed, in faith as well as academically.

Often, especially in the early elementary years, the situation is such that frequently our teachers spend more face time with our children than we

do. We, as parents, put an immense trust in the skills, the love, and the care that our teachers have for the children whom they are responsible for. I write this after spending time in the past week with children from the "Pathways" program, pre-K and Kindergarten, in one school; and the Kindergarten and grade one children in another of our schools. You know, I am sure I learned more from those kiddos than they learned from me. But I can assure you of two things they did learn from me. **One: That dear Jesus loves them. Two: Dear Jesus wants to be their friend.** 

Whether it is Archbishop Jordan High School, where I am blessed to have kids fist bump me or high-five me in the hallway. Whether it is our Middle Schools, where the young teenagers will sneak me a smile or say hello on the way by. Or whether it is our K-4 schools, where I feel like a rock star (whatever a rock star feels like), in the hallways or in the classroom. My time in our schools is always gratifying. I speak confidently on behalf of Fr. Mario, Fr. Ben and Deacon Lynn as well, who are faithfully present with our children weekly. We serve ten Catholic schools, and we do our best to have clergy in every one of those schools at least once a week.

My reflections this week center around the reality that when I am in any one of our schools, I always feel welcome. I know that I am in a Catholic ambience. At ABJ when prayer time happens in the morning, the hallways may be jammed, but traffic comes to a respectful silent standstill. We celebrate weekly Masses with the middle school kids at St. Theresa, one class at a time. I have been out to Camp van Es and Birch Bay Ranch for retreats, for Mass; with high school, elementary and middle school students. I have blessed and handed out many Bibles to many grade four students, on their leadership retreat day.

My role as pastor in a community like Sherwood Park, is to ensure that the faith that we profess is handed on in an authentic way - in the Church, in our schools, and in our community - as witnessing to what it is, to be a disciple of Jesus Christ. I am hyper-sensitive to this responsibility, because I know I will be accountable on the day I meet Jesus, face to face. Our publicly funded Catholic schools here in Sherwood Park and area are doing an excellent job. I am a realist by my nature, so I know that yes, there is always room for growth in any environment. Our schools know this, as surely as we know that we have progress opportunities here at OLPH parish. Friends, perfection will be in heaven. In the meantime, we all need to do our part, to form our young people in a way that will help them succeed in this world and arrive safely in to the next.

I want to share with you, that I am immensely proud of the relationship we, at OLPH, have with our schools. We know that we are welcome. There is always openness to new initiatives. The teachers, administration, and the Elk Island Catholic leadership, who are responsible for our children, are rowing in the same direction. **Home, Parish and School,** these are the three legs that will support our children in becoming the successful, faith-filled men and women that we desire for them. For me, as a priest who knows he needs to take the Gospel to where it can be shared, our schools are literally the vineyard for me to work in. They may not be at Mass on Sunday morning, for whatever reason, but I do know where our children will be on Monday morning. Thank you dear Jesus, for publicly funded Catholic education. Please help us to use this gift to it fullest advantage, for the benefit of Your/our precious children.

Finally, publicly funded Catholic education, is not only about those of you who have children in the system. All of us have had experience with Catholic education. Whether it was you, your parents, your children, or your grandchildren, **Catholic education in our schools is ongoing, relevant, and essential to all of us who profess to be Catholic.** Whenever and wherever the opportunity presents itself, we all must be "**Grateful Advo-cates for Catholic Education**" - *see next page for more about GrACE*. We must treasure, protect, and advocate for publicly funded Catholic Education whoever we are, wherever we are. This is a gift, the third pillar (home/parish/school), that our children require, to assist them in becoming well rounded, well formed, faith-filled Catholic young adults.
