

The birth of the long-awaited Messiah, incarnate in the person of Jesus Christ, begins the chain of events that brought about His life, death, resurrection, and ascension into heaven. In this last chapter of salvation history Jesus overcame death for one and for all; once and for all. His ascension into heaven made possible eternal life, in the presence of the glory of God; for you and me and all of God's children. With the birth of our Lord, the question, "where to from here?" became a real question for Joseph and Mary, as they were warned of Herod's plan to destroy the infant children of that time and place. They chose to go to Egypt until it was safe for them to return to their homeland.

So, where to from here, for us at OLPH, and the Archdiocese of Edmonton? Coming out of the pandemic years, the Archdiocese embarked on what we then referred to as a *Radical Rethink*. Partly, in response to the knowledge that we would be moving forward with about half of the resources (both people and financewise), to address the needs of the Archdiocese of Edmonton. We formulated twenty-five priorities. They revolved around putting infrastructure and mechanisms (communications, websites, payroll systems etc.) into place, so that we could move our Archdiocese forward from a solid foundation. Much like the man who built his house on rock (Mt, 7, 25), we knew we needed a solid foundation in place. This, in order to follow up with pastoral and evangelical priorities that directly affect the lives of our sisters and brothers in the pews, as well as those not presently gathered. We have drawn a line under our twenty-five priorities and believe that we are ready to gather where the rubber meets the road; in the pews, in our parishes and in our community.

So, where to from here? Within a year of the Radical Rethink, Pope Francis announced a world synod. His purpose, to hear from the faithful in the pews. Pope Francis wanted their perspective on what needed to be happening in their parish communities. This was a massive undertaking. In our Archdiocese there were four thousand voices heard, over approximately 350 listening sessions of all shapes and sizes. This input was then synthesized into a ten-page report. It was included as

part of a compiled report, a summation of the seventy Canadian Dioceses, and sent to Rome. The Canadian synodal report became part of a final document, compiled by the office of the Holy Father. We are aware, I am sure, that the Holy Father held his own world synod listening session in Rome during the month of September. These synodal documents (local, National and Vatican) can all be viewed on the Archdiocese of Edmonton website https://caedm.ca/synod. The interesting thing is the commonality of the people of the world, in what they saw as needs within our world Church. "Synodal means walking together." Providentially perhaps, the Kamloops unmarked graves became a focus two months after the pandemic began. This began a parallel synodal walk, from a Canadian perspective, with our Indigenous sisters and brothers. This, an extension of the ninetyfour "Calls to Action" presented in the Truth and Reconciliation document produced in 2015; after years of consultation with, and listening to, those who had suffered ill effects from the Canadian government imposed, Residential School system. A system that was operated by multiple religious denominations and Orders. The Catholic Church played a significant role in operating these schools.

Where to from here? All of this to say, "Walking Together" (synodality) although self-evident, is clearly the way forward for us as a country (in communion with our indigenous brothers and sisters), a Church, and I daresay, our family units. Back to the Radical Rethink. We feel the foundational infrastructure is in place. Our Radical Rethink is anchored in the Pastoral Letter, "Living in the Word of God," which Archbishop Smith promulgated in September 2017. The essential message of the Letter said, "We are to hear the Word of God, and we are to do it." The Archbishop's letter noted that we are to hear the word of God and do it in three distinct but related ways. "Worship, Witness, and Service." In these past months, with input from all areas of the Archdiocese of Edmonton, we have established the **Pastoral and Evangelical priorities** for the next few years. Attached to this writing is a preliminary draft that will share visually with you the essence, or broad stroke priorities, that we have come to as an Archdiocese. This is not an exhaustive list of priorities. It is based on synodal feed back, what we have heard from the priests of the Archdiocese by way of intentional input opportunities, and input from our Pastoral Administration Team. We do feel that we have done our best to be broadly

consultative in our efforts to glean input from our stakeholders (parishioners, clergy, staff), about the direction we are to walk together, as we discern **where to from here**?

So, where to from here? The eight Deaneries, (geographic groupings) that constitute all the parishes in the Archdiocese will now play a leading role in implementing these priorities. The Deans and Vice Deans will roll out a more defined set of priorities to our clergy. Prior to February 1, a small working group comprised of former synod members, clergy, and PAO Team members will flesh out and further define the wording and content of our presented priorities. Currently, we are asking our pastors to gather a small group of leadership from their parishes. This to begin talking about how on a local level they will strive to implement our stated priorities within their parish community. In essence, to define how these Archdiocesan priorities will be made manifest at the local parish level. Each individual parish will provide their plan to the Archdiocese at the beginning of May, outlining what and how they will go about implementing our stated priorities at the parish level.

Suffice to say, the pastoral priorities will not replace nor displace all the wonderful present pastoral activities within our parish communities.


