

"Today is born our Saviour, Christ the Lord, (Psalm 96)"

I had a unique experience in the days that led up to our Christmas celebrations. I have experienced *Simbang Gabi* (the nine novena Masses leading up to the celebration of the Nativity of the Lord), for many years. This Novena, originating in the Philippines, is extremely popular with the Filipino community. At St. Theresa and Corpus Christi, we have always celebrated these nine novena Masses at 7:00 pm. This year Fr. Mario had the brainstorm that we should celebrate them early in the morning, in the spirit of how they were celebrated back home in the Philippines. The fishermen would be coming home early in the morning, the farmers would be going out to the fields very early in the morning. They and their families would come to the Church for Mass incredibly early in the morning for the nine days leading up to Christmas. A beautiful, rich, spiritual and cultural tradition. So, we decided to give Simbang Gabi Novena Masses a try with a 5:30 am start. Couples for Christ supported this initiative, and we thought *if only twenty people show up for a 5:30 am Mass, so be it.* Imagine our pleasant surprise when through the doors came two hundred or so early birds for our first Novena Mass!

Our numbers stayed in that range all week, rising to 250 people on the final Saturday and Sunday December 24 celebrations. We had music, AV, adult servers, and a joyful atmosphere for our nine-day Novena Masses. What a wonderful event to have happen in our parish. A considerable number of our regular parishioners, from both OLPH and St. Francis, showed up regularly for these exceedingly early celebrations. Breakfast was provided after every Mass in the foyer, with all three of our priests showing up daily to celebrate the Masses together. Thank you dear Jesus. I am a fellow that likes to get an early start on the day; however, did you know that a 4:00 am. get up for nine days in a row, brings new meaning to the concept of sacrifice. Of course, now that we have run a highly successful first effort, how can we not do it next Advent? Thank you Couples for Christ for your sincere buy-in to this project. In particular, we thank Fr. Mario for his leadership and for taking the preaching duties for all nine days. Very well-done Fr. Mario.

The Novena ended with 5:30 am Mass on Sunday December 24. This was followed by three Fourth Sunday of Advent Masses at 8:30 am, 10:30 am, and 12:30 pm. Then the *flip*, if you will, of the Church from Advent season to Christmas colors and environment between the hours of 1:30 and 3:00 pm. Then off to the races with 4:00 pm, 6:00 pm, 8:00 pm, 10:00 pm and Midnight Christmas Eve Masses. Nine Masses in 18 hours! Finally, we welcomed Christmas day with our 8:30 am, 10:30 am, 12:30 pm and 7:00 pm Christmas Masses. Wow. As I

write this, it feels like I am bragging about what OLPH accomplished. Perhaps I am, but it is because I am so proud of the joyful celebrations that were celebrated in a beautiful, reverent, and organized way. My friends, by the grace of God we had music, adult servers, ushers, Eucharistic ministers, AV techs, greeters, and altar servers; filling the many, many opportunities for ministry in this short and busy period of time.

Not all Masses were full, but they all had significant attendance including our 7:00 pm Christmas Day Mass. I was pleasantly amazed at how many people attended, likely because they had been working during the day. All this to say my dear OLPH parishioners, thank you for your commitment to an especially important part of our Liturgical year: the Nativity of the Lord. My heart is full of gratitude for the very generous and giving ministries that made our celebrations possible and beautiful. As I write this, I have now had eight hours sleep, three nights in a row, and I feel pretty much normal. (At least as normal as your pastor ever is.) I write this, as we prepare to celebrate the *Feast of the Holy Family* on Sunday and the *Feast of Mary, the Holy Mother of God* on Monday. Please be aware the Mary Mother of God, January 1st, is one of two annual holy days of obligation in the Canadian Church. (The other being the Nativity of the Lord, Christmas.) Needless to say, there are fifty-two other Holy Days of Obligation. They fall like clockwork every Sunday, week after week, year after year. My dream for Our Lady of Perpetual Help parish is this: That we would be overwhelmed with attendees every week, like we were this past week, celebrating Christmas as a joyful commu-

nity of faith and love. We trust in God's good grace and God's good time, and that we will continue to do what we need to do in order achieve this dream. We need to name the goal if we are to have the hope of achieving it.

My friends, your pastor, Fr. Jim, will be away from January 2-26 on course in Arizona.

This is the longest break I have ever taken as a priest, with three weekends away from the parish. But with Fr. Ben, Fr. Mario and Deacon Lynn on deck, I feel comfortable to take the time. As a result of this, you will not see any of my written, rambling meanderings until the beginning of February. May our Lord bless you and your families with a healthy, happy, and holy year of our Lord 2024.
