

Speaker: Priska Strickler on Indonesian Missions



Did you receive your invitation? Did you RSVP?

Dear Jesus is hosting an After Party *before* the party. (Yes, I am trying to be cool with the lingo.) This week we will celebrate Ash Wednesday as the prelude to six weeks of preparation for the celebration of the central gift of our faith: the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ.

The death and resurrection, for us Christians, is understood to be the event in God's plan of salvation that overcame death once and for all; while in the same moment opening the gates of heaven for all who have a sincere desire to enter them. In some ways we can see it as an order of magnitude. We have four weeks of Advent in preparation for the nativity of our Lord; and we have six weeks of preparation for the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of the Savior of the world.

What does this "after party before the party," consist of for us? The Church offers us the opportunity - through the ascetic practices of **prayer**, **fasting**, **and almsgiving** - a focused time to prepare our physical and spiritual beings for engaging in the most profound gift, of the many, that our God has blessed us with: **Salvation**.

Why are we invited to engage more intentionally in these specific practices? To set the stage, it is reasonable to say that most of us profess to have busy lives. Regardless of what kind of busy we are speaking of (and often it is simply a very pragmatic busyness); it seems to be our human nature to fill our days with activities of one form or another. That might be reading a good book, making sure things are tidy around the house, working many hours for the almighty dollar, running children from one activity to another, caring for grandchildren... All these activities are good in and of themselves. What can occur during this busyness, is that we tend to forget about the giver of all that is good, the giver of the blessings we give thanks for in our quick prayer before bedtime. We may not forget about God, but He may get gently nudged off to the side, while we get the pragmatic necessities looked after.

Lent is the opportunity the Church offers us, to renew and refresh the most important relationship we will ever be blessed to be part of. Of course, that relationship is with our Lord Jesus. It is my view that our lives are enriched by the many relationships we are part of. It is also my view that the most important of our relationships, can often be the one we spend the least amount of time and attention on. Jesus modeled the importance of baptism

for us by being baptised Himself in the Jordan by John the Baptist. Jesus did not simply say; "Take this all of you and eat of it, for this is my body which will be given up for you," Jesus consumed the bread and the wine that he consecrated at the Last Supper. Why? Because Jesus knew we needed these sacraments and so He modeled them for us to ensure we understood the importance of them.

What did Jesus do prior to beginning His public ministry? He entered the barrenness of the desert, where he fasted and prayed without the distractions of everyday life, for forty days. He was able to focus His attention more completely and intentionally on preparing for what lay ahead for Him. Again, He modeled for us what needs to be done to achieve a successful, God-centered ministry. I suppose this might go without saying, though I won't go without saying it: If the Lord is modeling these things for us, there is a good chance they are important for us too. Jesus knew that to have any measure of success, he needed to put it in His heavenly Father's hands. You and I need to know that to have any measure of success here in the world, we need to put our efforts in the Lords hands.

Once again, our Lord models for us what is essential. Relationship with God, with one another, and with ourselves. The "desert after party (before party)" we are invited to during this Lent, really, is an awesome opportunity to grow in our relationship with the Lord. It has been my experience, and I am sure yours, that when things are good between us and the Lord, the other key relationships will be good as well. Friends, let us not look at Lent as something we must get through to get to the celebration. Let us see Lent for the gift and opportunity that it is: A time to prepare with joyful anticipation for the most important event in the history of the world! Prayer, fasting, and almsgiving are the three pillars that will support and prepare us on our Lenten journeys. Pray about what you would like to accomplish on your walk with the Lord during this Lenten season. Then pray for the graces of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving that will allow you to be intentional and set you up for success on this God-given opportunity.

Whether it be family, friends, faith, work-related, Lent is our gift and our opportunity to

be intentional in progressing in these aspirations. Prayer, fasting, and almsgiving will create room in our hearts; that we may more authentically nourish and cultivate our relationship with our Lord, with ourselves, and with one another. Happy Lent my friends. Did you receive your invitation? Did you RSVP?
