





## Ash Wednesday and Our Lenten Adventure

Of the many Liturgical events that occur year after year in our Catholic Church, I find Ash Wednesday to be one of the more inspiring celebrations. It is a moment in time when us Catholics come out of seclusion and announce to the world, *this is who we are*. In our schools, our Churches, our supermarkets; in a humble way we acknowledge the gift that is our Catholic faith. In this day and age, it is important to be witnesses in the public square. The secular narrative

overshadows the gift of our Catholic Christianity daily, with laws that disrespect the very dignity of human life; from abortion at the beginning, to assisted suicide and euthanasia at the end. Thankfully, this is God's Church and His truth and goodness will ultimately prevail, as it always has over the two thousand years of tumult and challenge.

When we reflect on the season of Lent, we can see that the Church has provided us with a magnificent opportunity to achieve that for which our Lord created us. We have been blessed with the opportunity to be *intentional* in our journey to holiness. Lent is undergirded by the three pillars of prayer, fasting and almsgiving.

So, what about this enigma we call **prayer** that takes many different shapes and forms; from "thank you dear Jesus," to the Holy Mass, which is simply a much longer prayer. The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC 2590) says about prayer: "Prayer is the raising of one's mind and heart to God, or the requesting of good things from God." (St John Damascene). The reality is that prayer is so much more, and there are a plethora of definitions for prayer. CCC 2626-2643 speak about five basic forms of prayer as follows:

- 1. Blessing and adoration
- 2. Petition (The three objectives which are the grace of forgiveness, the fullness of the reign of God, and our every need.)
- 3. Intercessory prayer (Asking on behalf of another)
- 4. Thanksgiving
- 5. Praise

I am not a theologian, but I do have a good understanding of the importance of relationship. With that said, prayer, in its essence, is our most pragmatic, tangible means of communicating with God. We all have important relationships in our lives. What we know about those relationships is that the more we communicate within them, the stronger the

relationship has the potential to become. Without effective communication, our relationships will suffer. With the Creator of the heavens and the earth it is no different. Our God desires to be in relationship with us and therefore is present to us 24/7, 365 days a year. The only weak link within this relationship is you and me.

Prayer of course, can take the shape of very real and practical corporal and temporal works of charity. St. Mother Theresa of Calcutta is an example par excellence, of works of mercy being expressed as prayer. Caring for the dead and dying in the streets of Calcutta was, for Mother Theresa, a critically important form of prayer by means of service. Yet her rule was strict; there are specific times of day when the Sisters of Charity are required to gather as a community for prayer. Mother Theresa knew well that anything good she and her Sisters were able to accomplish was purely by the grace of God. That grace did not happen by accident. Grace happened because the Sisters knew that when it was time to gather, they could bring all their challenges and crosses before the Lord. They were women of faith and they trusted in the Lord for all they were able to accomplish, or not.

My friends, the first pillar of Lent is prayer because everything depends on the grace of God. If we do not "raise our hearts and our minds to God" (St. John Damascene), that means we are depending on ourselves. This is a recipe, that even if it does not end in disaster, we will fall far short of that which we potentially can accomplish. *It is the Lord*. Our prayer, in its many forms of expression, is our way of saying "Lord, I need you. I value our relationship. This is our time together." As an aside, I have noticed that most of us know where to go and who to talk to when we need something. *It is the Lord*. The second step in our progression, when our prayers are answered, I believe is this: that we remember to be thankful to the giver of all that is good, for those prayers answered. *It is the Lord*.

Prayer is the connecting point in our encounter and relationship with Jesus. It is the anchor that will keep us linked to the Lord, when we are consistent at our end of the relation-

ship. This Lenten season, I invite/challenge you to incorporate something small into your regular prayer routine. If you have a prayer routine already, add some *Hail Marys* when you are shaving, or a *Glory Be* when you are washing your hair. Leave a note on your mirror to remind you to do it until you develop the habit.

As we enter into this Lenten opportunity, may our goal be that our prayer life, and relationship with the Lord, is a wee bit richer at the end of our Lenten journey than when we started.
