man share his 13-year incredible journey of recovery and resilience after surviving a stroke at a very young age.



Our Lenten Adventure Continues: Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving

Last week we focused our attention on the importance of prayer as the most pragmatic, tangible means of communicating with God. Without effective prayerful communication with our Lord, our relationship with Him will not flourish. The result of course, is that if we struggle in our relationship with the giver of all that is good, there is no doubt the other important relationships in our lives will not reach their God-given potential either.

Fasting is the second pillar of focus during our Lenten journey. The importance of fasting is not to be minimized. It is the fourth precept of the Church. "You shall observe the days of fasting and abstinence established by the Church, (CCC 2043)." Of note, this **precept** refers to days of **fasting and abstinence** within the Church, not fasting alone.

For clarity, **fasting** refers to limitations on food and drink. "In the modern Church, the regulations for days of fast prescribed taking only one full daily meal, plus breakfast, and a light meal." **Abstaining** means refraining from certain kinds of food or drink, typically meat. From the first century, the day of the crucifixion has been traditionally observed as a day of abstaining from flesh, meat, to honor Christ who sacrificed his flesh on a Friday. In 1966, Pope Paul VI confirmed the following: **The universal days of Fast and abstinence are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.** All Fridays in Lent are days of abstinence from meat is not practiced.

In Canada, in accordance with the prescriptions of Canon 1253, the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops decrees that "the days of fast and abstinence in Canada are: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fridays are days of abstinence, but Catholics can substitute special acts of charity or piety on this day."

"Church Law binds as follows: 1. The Law of abstinence (not eating meat) obliges those who have completed their fourteenth year. 2. The Law of fast only (one full meal each day, with nothing between meals) obliges those who have completed their eighteenth year until the beginning of their sixtieth year, (Catholic Source book p. 103)."

While we are on the topic of fasting and the plethora of obligations that come with them, a word on the **Eucharistic Fast**. Fasting before Communion has been a practice of

the Church from ancient times. It was universally practiced by the fifth century. Prior to 1953, the faithful were obligated to fast from midnight before Mass; including from food, water, and medicine. In 1957, Pope Pius XII reduced the time to three hours from food and alcoholic drink. In 1964, Pope Paul VI further reduced the fast to one hour, including all food and drink, but allowing water and medicine anytime. In 1973, the fast was reduced to fifteen minutes for the elderly and the sick.

"The seasons and days of penance in the course of the liturgical year (Lent and each Friday in memory of the death of the Lord) are intense moments of the Church's penitential practice. These times are particularly appropriate for spiritual exercises, penitential liturgies, pilgrimages as signs of penance, voluntary self denial such as fasting and almsgiving, and fraternal sharing (charitable and missionary works), (CCC 1438)."

So, lots of rules, ordinances, and obligations when it comes to the practice of fasting. At the end of the day, the reason we participate in these practices is for our own growth in holiness. As part of this journey, we need to be able to master that which tends to tempt us and lead us away from our spiritual focus.

My friends, I encourage you not to think of only food and drink when it comes to fasting. We can fast from TV and video games. We can fast from talking about our neighbor or ignoring our spouse. We can fast from negativity and judgement. But we need to be intentional about it. Once again the Church in her wisdom has blessed us with this time to be intentional. To focus our attention on removing the obstacles that impede a deeper, more meaningful relationship with our Lord. Fasting from worldly things can bless us with the time to engage in more meaningful spiritual prayer and meditation time. Fasting from worldly distractions can allow us to see with clarity that which is profoundly important.

Keep up the excellent work my friends. We are just over a week into our Lenten Adventure.
