Looking forward to...



My friends, I would like to invite you to an "interactive one week watch party." The party I am speaking of is HOLY WEEK; beginning with the Passion Sunday Masses, and culminating in celebrating the resurrection of our Lord Jesus at the Vigil and on Easter Sunday.

As I write this, I can safely expect that if you are reading this, you are planning already to participate at some level for sure. My thinking and my experience is this: Holy Week is the most profound time of year to connect with our faith and to enter more fully into the mystery of the love of God for you and for me. We practice and we celebrate our faith in or-

der to grow in our relationship with the Lord. The season of Lent is comparable to the regular hockey season. We do what we do - *around prayer*, *fasting*, *and almsgiving* - to get primed and ready for the playoffs.

The excitement really heats up when we begin the first round of the playoffs: Palm/Passion Sunday. We as a community of faith gather and we reenact the event of the triumphal arrival of Jesus into Jerusalem! A moment in time when it seemed the people had accepted Jesus for whom He was; their King, their Messiah, their Savior. The waving of the palms in the aisle of the Church, the palm blessing, and sprinkling with Holy Water, the joyful uplifting procession; all assist us in celebrating the messianic entrance of our Lord!

Round two of the playoffs begins on **Holy Thursday**, when the <u>only</u> Mass that can be celebrated that day is the **Mass of the Lord's Supper.** The institution of the Holy Eucharist by Jesus, to be celebrated *in perpetuity* by the disciples of our Lord. The washing of the feet of His disciples is a clear directive and call to discipleship and witness to the apostles and to us. "Do you realize what I have done for you? You call me teacher, and master, and rightly so, for indeed I am. If I therefore, the master and teacher, have washed your feet, you ought to wash one another's feet. I have given you a model to follow, so that as I have done for you, you should also do." It is a humbling experience for me to get on my knees and prayerfully wash the feet of a diverse group of our parishioners representing the Apostles. I suggest it is even more humbling to allow your feet to be washed in front of the entire parish community. During the celebration of this Holy Mass, we consecrate enough Body of Christ for the three Good Friday Services. Upon the completion of the Holy Mass, we then place the consecrated Body of Christ on the altar of repose and in procession, we transition to Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament until midnight, culminating with Benedic-

tion. It is from the end of the Holy Thursday Mass of the Lord's Supper, until we sing the Glory to God at the Vigil on Holy Saturday, that we wait with prayerful anticipation, for the return of our Lord and Saviour back into our parish community. Jesus is gone, He is in the tomb.

The playoff semi-final begins on **Good Friday**. Once again, we relive the passion and death of our Lord and Saviour. This is done in silence for the most part, as it is a solemn and somber time in the Church. We are invited to reflect on the suffering and death of our Lord, solely out of love for us, His children. The veneration of the cross brings into focus for us the absolute brutality of the death of our Lord on our behalf. It is a moment where we focus our attention on the ugliness and pain of the cross. Yet, it is through this instrument, used to torture and kill common criminals, that Jesus brought to fruition His saving plan. **Salvation through the cross**. Good Friday is a time of somber silence, as we reflect on the absence of Jesus, and on all that He endured on behalf of humanity.

The Stanley Cup final occurs on Saturday evening at the Easter Vigil. Through the reading of seven specific Scriptures and the lighting of the Easter fire, we pray/journey, in a very tangible way, through salvation history. The Scripture presented show that the hand of God has been present throughout the history of humanity, right from the Creation event to the resurrection of our Lord Jesus. The gradual coming to light of the Church during the readings adds a tangible feeling to the coming of the light. We witness the Baptism, Confirmation and First Eucharist of those who have been searching. The welcome of these searchers into the Christian community, moves us from a time of looking back and being conscious of God's saving plan, to a very real response to God's invitation to relationship that speaks to all of us. We witness the experience of a desire to know the Lord, coupled with the experience of finding and coming into full relationship with the Lord.

The Easter vigil is the culmination of Holy Week, it is the high point of anything we celebrate within the Catholic Church. If you have not experienced this monumental celebration, have a nap on Saturday afternoon, and come to the Church on Saturday evening. It is long and it is beautiful. Our **Easter Sunday Masses** continue the much-anticipated celebration of the resurrection of our Lord in a very beautiful and joyful ambience.

My friends, I have used the analogy of Holy Week as a journey through the NHL playoffs, but only because the more we enter into the celebrations, the more the excitement and anticipation builds. My encouragement to you this year, is to make the decision to participate fully in this remarkable liturgical journey, which is really the story of salvation history. It can be a truly rich and rewarding faith experience, when we open our hearts, and enter into the journey as fully as we are able.
