The Great Commission Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults/Children

You and I have been given a wonderful gift. Through baptism we became members of the universal community

of Catholic Christians which numbers about 1.2 billion in the world. It matters not what country we were born or raised, we hold the same foundational beliefs (dogmas), and we profess the head of our Catholic Church to be Pope Francis, the Bishop of Rome. A dogma is a universal non-negotiable belief, essential to be a Roman Catholic. Some of the basic but essential dogmas of our faith follow: *1. The divinity and humanity of Jesus Christ. 2. Our Trinitarian God, one Being, three distinct persons within the Holy Trinity: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. 3. Mary as the Mother of God. 4. The Real Presence of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist. 5. Jesus is God. We can expand on these later. My point, we as baptised Catholics have a unique and universal set of foundational beliefs that are essential to accept if in fact, we profess to be Catholic.*

We have a group of men women and young people who have been walking with us for anywhere between six months and a year. Most of these inquirers have been journeying through the structure of the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults here in the parish. However, three of our Archbishop Jordan students have been engaged in a program called Chosen, facilitated by the dedicated ABJ Chaplains on a weekly basis at lunch time. Splendid work Team. These individuals, some of whom have been baptised in other Christian denominations, some of whom, have not been baptised, have been journeying, inquiring, exploring the Catholic faith. Their goal is to discern whether they would like to become fully initiated into the Catholic Church. This generally happens at the Easter Vigil, Holy Saturday. For a good part of the past year, they have been journeying with very qualified catechists and their individual sponsors, meeting weekly to learn and to discern if this is where the Lord is calling them to.

It is a process that takes place in a structured but flexible way. They begin their journey as inquirers and for several weeks they learn the basic catechesis of the Catholic Church to give them a sense of what they are becoming involved in. This is referred to as the period of the **Pre**-catechumenate. At one point in time, they are asked if they wish to continue the journey. If the response is positive, they participate in the **rite of Acceptance into the Order of Catechu**-

mens. This next period is termed the **period of the Catechumenate**. Keep in mind that during this time they continue to meet weekly with their catechists, their sponsors and the RCIA community, learning more intensely and in depth, about the Catholic faith.

During the Lenten season, our Catechumens participate with the greater parish community, in what in what we call the **Period of Purification and Enlightenment**. This will include what many of you have witnessed on the second, third and fourth Sunday of Lent, the **Scrutinies**. The Scrutinies are an intentional moment in time where the catechumens witness to their faith publicly, in front of the parish community. It is also a time when the love and support of the parish community for our catechumens is emphasized. The catechumens give public witness to their journey, and we as a community of faith publicly witness our love and support for them on their journey. There is much more within this period, but the Scrutinies are visible and public. They are what we recognize as part of their journey toward full initiation into the Holy Catholic Church.

The Sacraments of Initiation, Baptism, First Holy Eucharist, and Confirmation are what take place at the Easter Vigil, which is the culmination of the preparations they have been engaged in for many months. It is a big moment in time for these Catechumens. They have been searching, journeying, and inquiring for many months, and the Easter Vigil is where it all comes to fruition. This is a joyful moment in time for the entire parish community, as we have journeyed scripturally through salvation history in a beautiful and deliberate way toward the coming of the light of the world in the person of Jesus Christ. Two beautiful parallels coming together on Holy Saturday at the Vigil.

The final period of initiation for our now fully initiated members of the Catholic community is the period of **mystagogy or post baptismal catechesis**. *The journey does not end with our baptism and the sacraments of Initiation, it is really just the beginning*. I heartily commend and support the nineteen men, women and young adults who have intentionally made the decision that they want to know more about this Church we call Catholic. I offer my gratitude and that of the parish to our catechists, chaplains, and our individual sponsors, who have faithfully walked with these men and women. Most of us fell into it by the grace of God and the good will of our parents. These brave individuals have been intentional on their

journey. They have said, "I want to know more." Thank you for your courage and your witness, all of you dear Catechumens. Our love, prayers and best wishes are with you on your journey to full initiation into the Holy Catholic Church, instituted by our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. Blessings,
