



Prayer, Fasting and ALMSGIVING

My friends, in the previous two issues we have talked about the value and modes of Prayer and Fasting. Today, we will offer some thoughts on everyone's favorite topic Almsgiving.

The Catholic Source book defines **Almsgiving** this way: "The practice of considering and treating all things, the earth and one's own life, (time, talent, and treasure) as belonging to God, and oneself as the manager, or steward, (1 Cor. 4, 1-2; 1 Peter 4, 10)"

Tithing is defined as the following. Tithing means giving away a portion of one's income, commonly a tenth. In the Old Testament, it involved paying a tenth of one's property as a tax to one's superior, (Gen. 14) and also giving a tenth of the fruit of the land and the increase of the flocks and herds to God (Malachi 3, 10, Lev. 27, 30-32, Numbers 18, 21-32,) These are just a few biblical references.

Sacrificial Giving: a voluntary, proportionate, Systematic, Sacrificial, and Liturgical giving of money, is part of the larger self-giving of Time, Talent, and Treasure. Support of the church is different from sacrificial giving, however, it is considered a by-product of this sacrificial giving. Support of the Church is one of the five precepts of the Church.

These definitions provided give us a sense of clarity about terminology. Through it's biblical roots, almsgiving stems from our God-given responsibility to care for the poor, *to give alms to the poor*. "The corporal works of mercy consist especially in feeding the hungry, sheltering the homeless, clothing the naked, visiting the sick and imprisoned, and burying the dead. Among all these, giving alms to the poor is one of the chief witnesses to fraternal charity. It is also a work of justice pleasing to God, (CCC 2447)."

I offer these preliminary thoughts because charitable giving, in its different forms, is an important part of the practice of our Catholic faith. I think at times it can be confusing about where our resources should be shared. I sign the tax receipts on a yearly basis, and it certainly paints a picture for me of the high priority some people place on supporting their parish community. I also am aware that many of the faithful have other charitable avenues for sharing their financial resources. For those of you who have perhaps not given much

thought to the concept of Almsgiving, I offer the following thoughts.

Charitable giving is a responsibility, just like paying our taxes and mortgage. My counsel is to look at the big picture at the beginning of the year. Based on what you believe you will have as disposable income, do an objective survey of areas that you would like to support, so set your number. Maybe it is ten percent, or maybe it is your first hours pay, which is about two and half percent. Maybe it is much more and maybe it is much less depending on circumstances of life. Regardless of the number you produce, name the areas of charity work that are important to you and your family. Set yourself up to give monthly, auto debit, credit card or whatever. Then be at peace with your decision.

We cannot be all things to all people, and we cannot support all charities with our limited alms. So, we need to be discerning, objective, and intentional. Then we need to stick with our plan, and evaluate our giving on a yearly basis. If you find you are supporting your church or charity with the same dollar amount you were making five or ten years prior, then you should evaluate what you are doing. My dad used to put five dollars in the envelope, and us kids would take turns putting the envelope in the collection basket. It seemed like a huge amount of money sixty years ago, and perhaps it was. Today we need to take an intentional look at our financial circumstances, work, and family situation. The Lord knows our hearts well. At the end of the day, our Almsgiving is simply a gift to the Lord via His church, His children, and His charity.

A final thought on Almsgiving. Yes, it is a good devotional and sacrificial practice. However, I believe it is reasonable to state that the generous sharing of our Time and Talent within particular charities, is a profound method of Almsgiving! I see many of the faithful in our parish sharing vast amounts of their Time and Talents, for the good of the many ministries of our parish community.

May this season of Lent present you with an opportunity to look at what you are doing with the Time, Talent, and Treasure that our Lord has entrusted to you to be a good steward of. This season of Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving is a wonderful moment for us to be intentional with our families on how it is, that we will steward that for which we have been given responsibility.
