





Re: Education Property Tax - Declaration of Separate School Support

Dear Catholic Elector,

The Elk Island Catholic Schools (EICS) Board of Trustees is committed to community engagement, advocacy, and transparency to ensure a strong connection with Catholic electors in each of our communities.

Did you know that Catholic Education is funded through education property taxes, grants, and general provincial revenue? As a Catholic elector, you should be aware of your right to direct your property taxes in support of Catholic Education. This right provides a vital connection between Catholic separate school boards like EICS and you, their electors.

Taxes declared in support of the Catholic separate school division benefit the children we are blessed to serve. The Constitution Acts of Canada and the Alberta *Education Act* stipulate that individuals who are Catholic must direct their education taxes to Catholic separate school boards where they exist.

In order to ensure your property taxes are supporting your Catholic separate school, you must declare your school support as "separate" on your annual property assessment notice and tax bill. If a declaration of school support is not filed by a property owner, the property assessment and tax bills will automatically show your school support going to the public school division.

If your support designation is incorrect, it should be corrected by completing and submitting Form 6A – School Support Notice Roman Catholic Separate Individual directly from the Alberta Government website (alberta.ca/property-tax). You can then submit this form to your local municipal government's taxation department. Please note that a change in school support does not take effect until the following calendar year.

Thank you for advocating for your faith-based schools and your right to support them with your local taxes.

Salvation Through the Cross

Not above it, not below it, not around it, but through the cross of Christ. This is the great dichotomy presented to us during this most holy of weeks. Our Lord Jesus brought salvation to humanity by dying the cruel death of crucifixion on the cross. Yet, from that cross sprang hope, when on the third day our Lord rose from the dead, and forty days later ascended into heaven. Thus completing His salvific mission, by opening the gates of heaven once again; and leaving them open, for all who have hearts that are open to the Good News of Jesus Christ. **The horrific struggle of the Passion of our Lord, His death on the cross, His resurrection on the third day, and ascension into heaven**. All of which leads you and me to great and glorious hope in something much more, something joy-filled and eternal: eternity in the heavenly kingdom. Friends, during this most holy of holy weeks, we celebrate the culmination of everything that our God wants for us, and the coming to fruition of God's saving plan, in the person of (Godman) Jesus Christ.

Welcome to our Triduum celebrations one and all. If you have been here for fifty plus years (and some of you have) if you are new to the Sherwood Park community, if you are visiting, if you are somewhere in between these parameters... WELCOME! Our Lord Jesus founded the Church on those He invited to journey with Him. Jesus did not promise wealth, status, or privilege. He simply invited and welcomed. ("Come follow me") My friends, this is our vision at Our Lady of Perpetual Help Catholic parish. We sincerely desire that you feel welcome when you enter the parish; whether for Mass, for prayer, for faith formation, or if you are simply stopping by the office to obtain information. Our heartfelt wish, is that you have a pleasant experience, whatever the providential reason you have come through the doors of OLPH.

We have no idea what experience you may be coming from on Sunday morning, or Wednesday evening for that matter, but our prayer and our hope is that you receive a smile and a welcome when you enter our parish community. We strive to celebrate our Liturgies with dignity and reverence; with full, active, conscious participation from the faithful. We believe that when you have a pleasant experience entering the Lord's home, that your heart will be more attuned and open to the loving message our Lord Jesus has for you at that moment in time. We have not perfected our welcome, or our Liturgies, but I assure you that we are always looking to improve and grow what is offered at Our Lady of Perpetual Help Catholic parish.

We celebrate the Holy Mass a minimum of sixteen times per week in the parish. The Holy Mass is celebrated at least twice a month, in eight independent living and care centers within our community. We schedule clergy classroom visits in each of our ten Catholic schools on a weekly basis. We offer a plethora of faith formation and catechetical opportunities, online and in person. Last year we celebrated one hundred and thirty Baptisms, one hundred and seventy-five First Communions, two hundred Confirmations, seventeen weddings and fifty funerals. Our service groups - the Catholic Women's League, Knights of Columbus, St. Vincent De Paul to name just a few - offer many varied opportunities for fellowship, stewardship and charitable action. My friends, we have much to offer you and your family. We welcome you and yours. If you are not presently engaged in some form of parish life, please consider it. When you allow Jesus to be an active part of your daily equation of life, great and wonderful things can happen.

Presently, we are in the process of formulating plans on how we will implement the three Archdiocesan Pastoral Priorities over the next four years. These priorities emerged out of valuable input from all facets (from

the pews to the PAO), within our Archdiocese. These priorities are based on the concept developed in Archbish-op Smith's 2017 pastoral letter, "Living in the Word of God through Worship, Witness, and Service" from which three broad based priorities emerged: 1. Eucharistic Formation. 2. Forming Confident Witnesses. 3. Formation for Service to Families and Marriage. The beauty of these wide ranging, but important components of our faith is this: Each parish is invited to develop plans on how best to implement these priorities, based on the particular needs and situation of their parish community. This gives us autonomy, while at the same time working toward unified, stated Archdiocesan goals. These priorities, coupled with our vision of becoming a "Compassionate Parish" will offer vast opportunities for you to engage in the life of our parish community.

Finally, my friends, we have some major capital projects at various stages of development. We are in the process of reimagining our foyer with upgrades to our AV system as part of this project. This will include full inhouse AV capability in the parish hall, as part of these upgrades. We are facing inevitable reality, and replacing the vertical portions of our roofing system. There has been much time, money and effort spent over many years, trying to eliminate the ever-persistent leaks we have consistently endured. This is the correct solution and this project will be ongoing from May-October of 2024. We will be upgrading our sanctuary altar area with high quality ceramic tile beginning in January 2025. The goal of this project is to assist us all in recognizing that this is the Holy of Holies within our Church.

We continue discussions with our stakeholder partners on the "Affordable Seniors Housing," that has been proposed for our property directly west of the Church. The non-negotiable vision we have adopted for this project is that it must provide the ability of our parishioners to "age in place." There are many moving parts to this project, but we move forward with hopeful hearts. Our dream/vision is to offer our long-time faithful parishioners a residence where they can live in a Catholic community, and are able to walk to Mass indoors daily, if they so desire.

Salvation Through the Cross. The answer to all that is important. You and I, my friends, we need to cooperate as fully as we are able in the saving mission of our Lord Jesus Christ. I am proud to say that Our Lady of Perpetual Help parish provides something for everyone who desires to follow the Lord. Please take some time and explore this bulletin, or our website, as an opportunity and an invitation to engage with OLPH, in the way that you feel drawn to and as you are able. We welcome you at Our Lady of Perpetual Help Catholic parish, wherever you are at on your journey of faith.
