#### "Little children, let us love, not in word or speech, but in truth and action, (1 Jn. 3, 18)."

It is not my intent to present a homily based on this Sunday's second reading. It is however, providential that as I was reflecting on what I would write about this week, the above Scripture hit me right square in the lookers.

I had the pleasure once again last Saturday, of participating (in a supporting role only) in the **Sherwood Park Against Hunger** event that we hosted here in the parish hall at OLPH. Why is this noteworthy? We have many activities occurring in our parish community at any given time during the week. The reason for my focus on this particular activity is that it was very much an ecumenical and collaborative initiative. The basic principle of this activity is that a group of people, working together in an assembly line fashion, put together an exceptionally large number of meals in a short period of time. Our goal last weekend was to prepare **100,000 meals** that simply need water and heat added to make a not fancy, but nutritious meal. These meals are shipped, depending on the need, off continent in some cases; to Northern Canada in others and to local charitable service organizations within our greater community in still other scenarios.

What I find incredibly beautiful about this meal packaging event are two things. One: This is a charitable work that is performed purely for the good of the other, for those who have need. Two: There is a wide-ranging collaboration between funders and among the volunteers who make this event an enormous success. This is literally a gathering of the community, working together in a very practical way, simply for the common good. In many ways, I see this as how the early Church began its journey into being what she is today. "All who believed, were together and had all things in common. Every day they devoted themselves to meeting together in the temple area and to breaking bread in their homes. They ate their meals with exultation sand sincerity of heart, praising God and enjoying favor with all people. And every day the Lord added to their number those who were being saved, (Acts 2, 44-47)." This is the genesis of our Catholic Church. It flourished through the good will and generous hearts of those early believers. All under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit of course. They lived their lives joyfully with the good of the other as their focus. Others saw the joy they lived, and they wanted some of what those early Christians had.

The meal packaging event is a collaborative effort that is funded by several stakeholders: the Rotary Club, the Emmanuel Foundation, Our Lady of Perpetual Help parish, the Knights of Columbus, Save On Foods and St. Vincent de Paul Society. It requires about twenty -five thousand dollars to purchase the food stuffs and materials to package one hundred thousand meals. These same groups, out of their combined volunteer bases, and with large additional volunteer assistance from the Latter-Day Saints, provided a total of about two hundred volunteers who filled a morning and afternoon shift putting the meals together. All this happening

in a busy and exuberant atmosphere in our parish hall.

There is much organization required to facilitate a large group of volunteers in an effective, productive manner. There are basically ten separate stations of three tables placed end to end, with about ten volunteers at each set of tables, each with a simple but specific job to complete the packaging of one meal. The simplicity and the beauty, is our diverse greater community, working side by side to fulfill a communal charitable goal. This cross-creed-culture collaboration is what we are called to as Catholic Christians. I wandered from workstation to workstation, encouraging and teasing where required. I was struck by the solidarity of these sometimes quite diverse groups of men, women and youth; working side by side, sharing conversation, a laugh or two, but at all times focused on the common goal of feeding those who are in need.

As a Catholic Church, we do good works for many charitable needs, in many areas. Most often we do this within a specific ministry group within the Church, like Development and Peace, Inner City Pastoral Ministries, The Clothing Nook, St. Vincent De Paul, the Knights of Columbus, the Catholic Women's League, JETS. These are wonderful groups of people working toward a common charitable goal. What is unique and beautiful about the food packaging event is the diversity, and I would say the anonymity, of the groups. We all work as one group toward a common goal, with no concern about creed or culture, or recognition. My friends, my point: This world we live in has become increasingly divisive in the way we interact with one another. I don't think the pandemic helped anyone. It exacerbated some already existing divides in our society. Last weekend's Food Packaging Event was a very real and practical lived example of what we are called to, as disciples of Jesus Christ. We will host and participate in this event again. Stay tuned for the opportunity to join in.
