



What's Happening at OLPH

For the last 3 years, OLPH has been running a catechesis program for 3-6 year olds that was initially developed by Maria Montessori and has since grown into an international ministry.

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS) was meticulously developed to meet the very real spiritual needs of children in this age group in order to introduce them to Jesus, the Good Shepherd, who loves them and calls them each by name.

For the adults (catechists), who have had the privilege of working with the children, it has been an incredible privilege to observe how God speaks deep truths to these small ones. This last year we had to turn children away because we only had enough trained catechists to work with 20 children per year.

SO, we are looking for parishioners who are interested in learning more about this incredible ministry and potentially receiving the required training. Because of its intentionality, the training requires 2 weeks of training, spaced about a year apart. The nearest training happening next will be in Regina from July 2-7.



Jesus, the Reason for Our Hope

Many of our faithful have asked me if I am rested after a very busy Holy Week. My response is two-fold: 1. Yes, I am relatively rested after a very busy Holy Week. 2. My happily accepted reality is that I average 12-14 hours a day, seven days a week, engaging in different elements of parish ministry. What can I tell you? I love what I do.

As a result, Holy Week is as busy as is usual for me, but it is a different kind of busy. The kind where I must study up on what we did an entire calendar year ago in a particular celebration. Our Liturgy committee, as a group, went through and dissected our previous Holy Week protocols over a month ago in preparation for this most holy of Holy Weeks. A year is enough time for even the young minds at the table to be a little foggy on "how we did it last year." I love the process, because it gives us an intentional opportunity to improve the quality and the reverence of our celebrations each year.

Holy Week, beginning with Passion Sunday, never ceases to bring joy into my heart. This, despite the fact that we relive/reimagine the Lord's Passion and death on the cross twice during the week; including an opportunity to venerate a replica of the cross that Jesus died on, for one and for all. One of the things that gratifies me is the multitude of folks who, during Holy Week, attend Mass and Good Friday Services. From Palm Sunday and forward, there is an extraordinary number of people coming through the doors of our parish Church. It is a joyful experience for me. It seems like my children (if I had any), many who have been away doing other things, have come home for the most momentous time of the year. This, coupled with

the gathering of many family members with their biological families from far and wide, creates a truly joyful, faith-filled family atmosphere. It is part of our baptismal DNA, that no matter what we have been up to during the year, we need to be at the Church during Holy Week. This always fills me with, as stated joy, but also with hope.

I want to comment on, and offer thanks for, the wonderful commitment that so many of our parishioners make during this time. There is a great diligence required to facilitate the many services that occur, that are over and above the mainstream life of our parish community. The splitting of the palms in preparation for Palm Sunday. The preparation of the Church for a literal changing of the seasons in preparation for the Easter Vigil. The excitement of those who are in their final preparations for entry into the Holy Catholic Church. Many of our dear people work behind the scenes for literally days preparing the environment, the readings, the candles, the candidates. There are many moving parts to this wonderful event we call the Triduum.

Another two-fold blessing in the life of our community occurred at our mission parish, St. Francis of Assisi in Tofield. 1. For the first time that anyone can remember we celebrated the entire Triduum at St. Francis. This, because St. Francis is thriving and growing. 2. We welcomed three men from the parish into full communion in the Catholic Church through the RCIA process. This is incredibly significant because St. Francis is a small but zealous community of believers. Thank you dear Jesus.

A good example of many moving parts working in a synchronized way is the Easter Vigil, the biggest celebration in the liturgical year of the Church. This celebration begins with a large fire outside of the Church, symbolising the coming of the light into the world. The *Exsultet* proclamation is a once a year happening, but it is critical that it is proclaimed well, and it is. Within the Vigil Mass itself, there are three distinct components. It opens with the Liturgy of the Word, followed by the Baptismal and Confirmation Liturgy and completed with the Liturgy of the Eucharist. Each of these three parts of the Vigil Mass are distinct and different from what typically transpires, Sunday after Sunday throughout the year. Many of our people expend much time and talent making sure that these unique facets of the celebration go well. I can tell you once again that I am very gratified with how everything went, not just with the Vigil but with the entire Triduum, from Palm/Passion Sunday to Easter Sunday. **Thank you all, for your role in celebrating the resurrection of our Lord Jesus with dignity, reverence, and grace.**

We will complete the Octave of Easter this Sunday with our Eucharistic Liturgies and with our Divine Mercy Chaplet Prayer and Adoration Hour at 3:00 pm on Sunday afternoon. I said recently that I am proud to be the pastor of Our Lady of Perpetual Help parish. The love and care with which we celebrated the Triduum, as a community of faith, simply affirmed once again for me, that I am blessed to serve the Lord here at OLPH. Thank you dear Jesus.
