**SPECIAL SUMMER CLASS: *Baptism Preparation for Families with School Age Children***

**BAPTISM** opens the door to the rest of our Catholic Sacraments. *If your child (age 7-10) attends Catholic school but is not yet baptized, we have special support for your family this summer!*

Grade 2 is when parents can start preparing their child to celebrate First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion, but first the child must be baptized. Children age 7 and up are considered the “age of reason” and are old enough to be active participants in their own sacramental preparation. If your child will be entering Grade 2 or higher next fall, and you wish for them to receive the sacraments with the rest of their Catholic school



classmates, we invite your family to have your child baptized this summer.

**Happy Summer my friends. We are Hiring.**

My dear friends, for those of you with children, the end of June can be an exciting time for all concerned. For those of you who are instructing those same children, therapy may seem like a viable option. There is something wonderful about the end of June no matter what your situation in life is. The days are long, for the most part they are sunny and warm, things are green and growing. There is a general sense of well-

being among most people. Vacations and time away to look forward to, and rightly so.

The only one who does not take time off, or even take His foot off the gas a little bit is our dear Jesus. Joking aside, dear Jesus is on the job 365/24/7. Let’s face it. Jesus has a magnificent work ethic. Holy understatement Batman. All this to say: Our twice daily weekday Masses will continue during the summer months. We will continue to celebrate Mass at least bi-weekly at our eight seniors residences/care centers. We will continue to baptise the little ones. And we will continue to celebrate five Sunday Masses at OLPH, and one at St. Francis in Tofield, every weekend.

My question this day is *“How about you?”* Will you continue your regime of prayer and worship throughout the summer months? Our relationship with the Lord is the most important relationship we can cultivate and nourish in our lives. My encouragement to all is that as our Lord does not take time away from his saving role in the world, so neither should we. I do understand there are occasional circumstances where it is not feasible to get to Mass on Sunday. You are traveling at that moment in time; you are at the lake and there is no reasonable way of getting a ride into town for Mass. Having said that, when I am away, I look at getting to Mass as an adventure. Also, as a way of seeing how others celebrate the most important part of our faith. ***My encouragement to you, my friends, is that you use some of the extra time you inherit during the summer to include Jesus into your summer schedule.***

**“Let your yes mean yes.”** My dear liturgical ministers, musicians, adult servers, extraordinary ministers of the Eucharist, proclaimers, altar servers, AV techs. In no particular order, I exhort you to continue your faithful service in whatever ministries you are presently engaged. **“Nevertheless, the liturgy is the summit toward which the activity of the**



**church is directed; it is also the source from which all its power flows,** (#10 Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, Vatican Documents).” If the Church in her wisdom says we can’t take our foot off the gas, then we should not.

I am incredibly grateful for our many faithful parishioners, who serve so faithfully and so diligently, week after week, year after year. I also feel the need to recognize the **absolute importance of the Holy Mass, particularly our Sunday Liturgies.** We do nothing in our parish more important than celebrating the Sunday Mass together, nothing. *“Nevertheless, the liturgy is the summit toward which the activity of the church is directed; it is also the source from which all its power flows, #10)”*

“It is very much the wish of the church that all the faithful should be led to take that full conscious and active part in the liturgical celebrations, which is demanded by the very nature of the liturgy, and to which the Christian people, ‘a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a redeemed people, (1 Pet. 2, 9, 4-5)’ have a right, and to which they are bound by reason of their baptism, (Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy #14).”

My friends, this document is over sixty years old but is no less relevant today than it was then. It is, for us, a privilege to participate in the Holy Mass, as this is where the grace of God is most prevalent. How much more grace and gift is it, that we are asked to assist in making the Holy Mass a grace-filled moment for others. I will speak in plain language my friends, as you know I am prone to. Our Sunday Eucharistic Liturgies are the most important thing we do at Our Lady of Perpetual Help parish. They are also the most important thing you will do during any given week. We should never have a Sunday Mass without an adequate supply of Eucharistic Ministers, Adult Servers, Ushers, or Musicians. These are non-negotiable needs for a parish of our size. So, two thoughts: Please sign up for ministry. I will not ask you at the last minute prior to Mass. I/We need you to make the commitment to be present and engaged. I don’t need a complete choir. I do not need a person to play, although it is a genuinely nice touch. I need some folks to lead the congregation in giving praise to God. I don’t need six Eucharistic ministers. The adult server and I can distribute Holy Communion, but it will add ten-fifteen minutes to the length of the Mass.

Brothers and Sisters, **“Let your yes mean yes, (Mt. 5-37).”** We need you. Go to [SignUp Genius online at olph.ca](http://SignUpGenius.online.at.olph.ca) or stop at the parish office and we will get you trained and organized.

Happy Summer my friends. We are Hiring, ministers to serve in God’s vineyard. The rewards are eternal.
