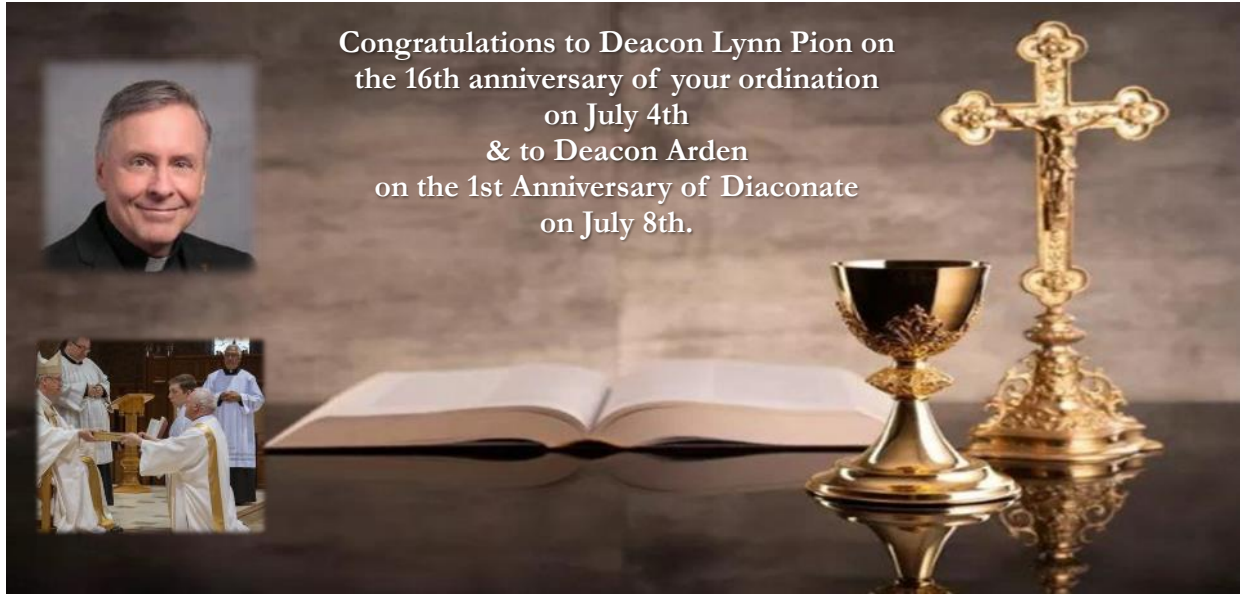

No, we are not installing solar panels on the roof of our parish Church, although it is a strange site when we gaze up at the vaulted portions of our parish roof these days.

Certainly, you are aware that we are replacing the existing metal roof with a new roofing system. We are doing this because of the constant leakage issues we have dealt with ineffectively, and at considerable cost, for many years. Our contractors are stripping the old roofing completely away, right down to the wooden planks that we can see from the interior of the Church.

They have covered the planks with plywood, which has been covered with an impermeable membrane (vapor barrier). The horizontal slats that you see traversing the roof are the supports that will hold the roofing insulation in place once we are ready for that stage of the project. So, although it appears that we are very progressive, and are incorporating solar, I am afraid we are not. The cost of this roofing system will be one million dollars, give or take a few dollars, yikes. So further thinking along the solar lines was not part of the conversation on this particular project.

We began celebrating our 6:15 evening Masses on Monday July 1st. in the parish hall. It has gone well thus far. We have set forty chairs with an altar and tabernacle. We are live streaming our evening celebrations just as we always have. We know that there are several of the faithful, who consistently join us from away for our evening celebrations. Our Wednesday and Friday 5:15 adoration is held in the parish hall as well. Although the ambience is not exactly Church-like, I do feel the reverence of the faithful, and the presence of our Lord in our celebrations. Reconciliation is still available upstairs in the Reconciliation room after the Holy Mass.

Have you noticed that our interior and exterior spaces here in the parish are looking nicer than usual? We have flowers in our large southern planters and at the front doors of the Church. Serious progress is happening within our plentiful green space shrubs that surround our parish Church. We are blessed to have acquired the services of four young Catholic men and women this summer through the Canada Summer Jobs program. We came to this wonderful initiative through the prompting of one of our Parish Council Members, MP Garnet Genuis. The Federal government covers the cost of wages for these young people, who are required to be in the age spectrum of fifteen to thirty years of age. Of course, the principal is to provide them with meaningful employment, which will assist them, as they continue their education and studies after high school. **Annika, Abbey, Dmytro, and Noah**, have already been a great blessing to our parish team.

They are fine Catholic young people, from good families. They love Jesus. They have excellent work ethics and good attitudes, as they take on the different, often more humble pro-



jects within our parish community. We are incredibly grateful for your service my friends. I cannot think of a more appropriate ambience for young Catholic men and women, to be performing their summer jobs.

Next week will be wild and woolly as Vacation Bible Camp takes place at OLPH. We will have well over one hundred young people ages four+ engaged in a wonderful week of structured, faith, fun and family activities. Sharon Darbyshire has been working ceaselessly for several months now with her faithful volunteers to prepare for this Monday morning. One of the very cool parts of VBS is that we have a number of our Elk Island Catholic students assisting with the set up, and facilitation of the camp this summer. It is a wonderful circumstance, when older peers function as leaders and witnesses for the very young of our parish community. Peers witnessing to peers is always a powerful way of sharing the Good News.

Finally, someone asked me the other day if we would be canceling our ministry to our Seniors Homes and Care facilities or eliminating any of our Mass times during the summer months. The answer is an **unequivocal NO**. Last week I wrote about the reality that Jesus is on task 24/7/365. It is my belief that consistency is what will build and increase a community. When people know they can come to Mass at a particular time or go to Reconciliation after that Mass, they do so. If there is a question in their mind, they will not come. The only way this can occur, is with consistent, consistent, consistent, presentation of these opportunities. **My friends, we are open for business in the summer of 2024.** The office is open 07:30 to 7:30 seven days a week, except for statutory holidays. The only glitch being, that if you drop in to pray, you may be accompanied in prayer by our roofing contractors, who are offering their own form of prayer up on the roof.
