Martha & Mary

It is interesting where the inspiration comes from for topical matter on my weekly writing. In this week's gospel, we encounter Jesus paying a visit to the home of Martha and Mary. A couple of thoughts go through me when I reflect on this reading. One is, am I a Martha or a Mary? Of course, I always land on the side of Martha. The other thought is, how would I manage things if Jesus were to come and visit my home? One thing is for sure, if I had any warning, I would make sure all my dishes were put away, and the vacuuming was done. That said, what if I did not know He was coming and He just dropped in for a visit? Of course, I am speaking of a literal visit, but it is reasonable to say that our Lord stops by for a visit every day, in a figurative but real sense, in our daily lives. I am probably understating this. Our Lord in the person of the Holy Spirit is with us always and everywhere. The challenge for us, is to be aware of, and embrace His presence.

For most of us, summer is typically when things slow down and we have an opportunity to take a breath, revitalize, and rejuvenate. I recognize that this is not the case in all families. Perhaps January is more the right time for some to travel back home and do the R and R thing. My meandering revolves around the concept of being a Martha or a Mary, or at least labeling ourselves in that way. I slot myself in as a Martha, but in my heart I wish to be more Mary-like, in the sense of prayerful, reflective time with the Lord. Please know I am not putting my agenda or any agenda forward. However, I do not consider that being a Martha is a character flaw, or a shortcoming in our personality, if we approach it with an appropriate perspective. I do think balance is an essential element in our lives, no matter in which camp we pitch our tent.

St. Therese of Lisieux coined the expression "The Little Way" as a way of offering praise and worship to our Lord Jesus. Her premise was that whatever she was tasked with washing floors, cooking meals, praying in the chapel - she offered these activities as a prayer of praise to her Lord and Saviour. So, in fact whatever she was doing, no matter how mundane it might seem, it gave her the opportunity to be in a prayerful disposition every day all day. What is a prayerful disposition? It is simply an intentional method of being in relationship with Jesus. It is a way of recognizing that all we are, all we have, and all we do, are pure and simply gifts of love from our Lord Jesus. In my life, I find it challenging to simply "be." It is something that I do strive for, but my mind wanders and I am thinking about the next thing, whatever it is. St. Therese passed at the age of twenty-four and she has been named a Doctor of the Church; a title held by very few, so it is reasonable to attach some credence to her approach to spirituality.

For me, I am grateful for sure. The Lord has been so incredibly good to me. My gratitude feels like it needs to be expressed in action. But the reality is that for me, gratitude can/ should also be expressed in the quiet of the Church or the Blessed Sacrament chapel. This might be construed as a self-reflection, but I am inviting you to be part of this reflection, regardless of whether you self-identify as a Martha or a Mary. The other part of this conversation that I believe to be pertinent, is what stage are we at on our journey of life. When you were raising your children, you likely did not have ten minutes, or ten cents to rub together. Now the kids are grown, perhaps the grandkids, and great grandkids as well. Maybe now it is time to see what Jesus meant when He said Mary has chosen the better part and it will not be taken away from her.

Finally, the really good news is that our Lord Jesus knows our hearts better than we ourselves. We all have a God-given Martha or Mary proclivity, which does not make us any more or less a child of God. The key for you and me, is to be honest in our introspective discernment, about what we are desirous to accomplish. The Lord already knows what is in our hearts. If we are endeavoring to serve the Lord in a healthy, holy way - whether in the chapel or in the kitchen - all will be well. Going back to my mid-July comments though, perhaps

this is a time for us to sit out on the deck and take the time to have a conversation with the Lord. The topic being, how it is we can best grow in our relationship with Him, in whatever "Little Way" we are called. The challenging part for most of us is to be intentional in our listening. We are generally fairly good at telling the Lord what we need. Listening for His response is where the rubber meets the road.
