LOOKING AHEAD

As pastor at OLPH, I have two stated goals, and I pray that they are yours as well. One, is to provide the most welcoming parish atmosphere in the Archdiocese. Two, is to increase the degree of reverence we maintain when we celebrate the Holy Mass. As I know you are aware, the rituals we participate in, the gestures we engage in, the postures we assume - leading up to and during the Holy Mass - all have one single goal. That is, to draw each of us deeper into the mystery of God's love for us. When you enter the Church foyer, someone will smile at you, welcome you, and perhaps open the door from the foyer into the nave for you. The goal is to assist you in knowing that you are welcome and you are home.

Something as simple as dipping our finger in the baptismal font and blessing ourselves with the sign of the cross is incredibly significant. We are remembering our baptism that brought us into the Catholic Church and made her sacraments possible for us. We are also acknowledging the cross as the source of our salvation. It was through the cross that Jesus overcame and atoned for the sins of humanity. It was in virtue of His resurrection from the dead, that Jesus overcame death, for one and for all. When we bow, or genuflect, as we enter the pew, we are publicly witnessing to the fact that God is God, and we are not. He is the King of Creation, and we His humble servants come to be in His presence.

The ambience we worship in assists in creating an environment conducive to efficacious worship. Meaning, when we come to Mass, our hope and our goal is to receive as much grace as is possible, during our time in the Lord's presence. When we kneel upon entering our pew, we implicitly are drawn into a prayerful way of being. When we are kneeling, there is not much question what we are about. We are endeavoring to have a conversation with our Lord Jesus. The music, which is an integral part of the celebration, assists in setting the stage and assisting us in knowing that we have entered into something bigger than ourselves.

Have you have had the opportunity to enter some of the churches of Europe that are many hundreds of years old? One of the things that will hold you in awe is the beauty, the grandeur, and the architecture of these beautiful edifices; built as a testimony to who God was in the lives of Christians, many hundreds of years ago. It is mind boggling to think about the commitment, expense, and time that went into the construction of these symbols of God's presence in their communities. St. Joseph's Basilica is an exceptionally beautiful and magnificent structure, and testimony to God's presence in the Archdiocese of Edmonton.

I offer these thoughts as we go through a methodical upgrade and beautification of Our Lady of Perpetual Help parish. Our signage on the median of Brower Drive is a significant statement of who we are in the Sherwood Park community. The complete revamp of our roof structure was necessary for us to make the upgrades to the interior of our parish church. Our parish is a beautiful structure architecturally. The vaulted roof system, in a way, points to heaven. The crucifix affixed directly over the tabernacle, draws our eye to the centrality of our faith: The death endured on the cross, while in the tabernacle directly below is new life, in the Real Presence and the resurrection of our Lord. Our altar and ambo are beautiful marble structures within the sanctuary. The stone tile that will be placed in the sanctuary in the coming month or so, is another effort to remind us that this is in fact the Holy of Holies. It is the Lord's house and there is nothing we can do to make the Lord's home too nice or too beautiful.

At the end of the day, as we view these improvements and beautifications, there is an implicit message sent into our cognitive senses: When we come into the church, we are entering and participating in something far bigger than we ourselves; something holy, something eternal.

There is nothing we can do to further endear ourselves to the Lord. His love for us is already absolute; whether we are good, bad, or a combination of the above. The only thing we can do for our Lord Jesus is to be faithful to the best of our ability. The purpose for our improvements and beautification in our parish church, is to assist each of our OLPH faithful to grow deeper in that faith, and deeper into the mystery and wonder of God's love for each of us. Every ritual, process, sacramental, devotional, beautiful worship space, building on one another ultimately has only one purpose. That is to assist us in growing in the most important relationship we will ever be part of: our relationship with Jesus Christ. **That is the relationship that will get us to heaven!**
