"Faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things unseen, (Heb. 11,1)"

In the past month or so we have been witness to some horrific events, which hit a little too close to home, both geographically and from a faith perspective. The shooting at Annunciation Church in Minnesota resulted in the loss of two young lives, and major trauma for the surviving elementary school children present in the church. This week a popular Christian activist/influencer, Charlie Kirk, was shot and killed while speaking at a university campus in Utah. On Thursday afternoon, Archbishop Jordan High School found themselves in a lockdown situation, after a report of a gun being present on the school campus. By the grace of God, the reported gun was found to be a replica, and the school lockdown was lifted after a relatively short investigation; albeit with a heavy police presence in and around the school. This was a traumatic event for the students, staff, and parents of Archbishop Jordan. The well-prepared trauma response teams within Elk Island Catholic Schools will be present for students and staff in the coming days.

The ABJ scenario proved to be one of poor judgment by a young person. However, the preceding world events of the past weeks have served to exacerbate the fear and the trauma caused in those directly affected by Thursday's lockdown at ABJ. Parents, staff, and students are hard pressed not to see the parallels between past events and the immediate scenario within their own school. Though this was a particularly challenging moment in time for all concerned, the blessing is that the school, the district, and the police, had plans in place to deal with just such an incident. Because of foresight and preparedness, this unfortunate situation was managed with the expediency and gravity necessitated by the nature of the event. The district and the school have plans in place for scenarios like this, and situations of this nature will always be taken very seriously until the perceived threat is dealt with. So, yes this was a traumatic event for all concerned; but emergency preparedness was in place and put into action as required. For this we can be very thankful.

With that said, you and I have another tool for dealing with these kinds of situations, and that is our faith. "We know that all things work together for good for those who love God, who are called according to His purpose, (Rom. 8, 28)." Difficult and challenging things will happen in our midst, in this world we live in. For you and me, as people of faith, we do not need to live in fear. We know that the Lord walks with us on our journeys of life. We, as God's children, live in awareness, in preparedness and we trust in the Lord. This is

what transpired at ABJ on Thursday. A difficult situation arose. In an abundance of caution emergency preparedness measures were put into play and the situation was diffused. The Lord was part of that scenario for sure. The proper steps were initiated, and a good and healthy outcome was the result of these efforts.

In times of trial, we need to be prepared to act and to do what is necessary. But those actions taken are the result of much pre-planning and preparation; so it is not fear, but awareness and preparedness, that motivates all our actions. Our faith is what allows us to move forward in confidence with these necessary steps, because we trust that all things work together for good, for those who love God. We know that God loves His dear children and wants only good for them/us.

My friends, we cannot allow the divisiveness, which is so much a part of the world that we live in, to become part of our worldview. We are people of faith and community. We must trust in God, and depend on one another; trusting in the goodness that we have been created in, God's own image and likeness.

The events in North America and at ABJ are unfortunate for sure. We, for our part, need to hold our heads high, and continue to "walk the talk" as disciples of Jesus Christ. We trust in faith that He walks with us, always. My prayers and heart goes out to the students, staff, and parents of Archbishop Jordan High school this week. We need to pray for their recovery from the trauma they have been exposed to. We also need to pray in thanksgiving, that those responsible for emergency preparedness at ABJ acted decisively and effectively for the safety and well being of those entrusted to their care. Thank to our County of Strathcona Emergency Response Teams for their stellar management of a challenging situation, and most of all, thank you dear Jesus.
