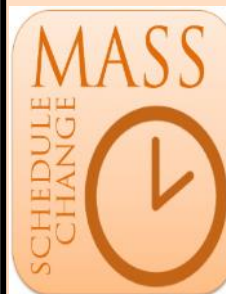

Stand Up and Be Counted

“In those days, a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that the whole world should be enrolled...So all went to be enrolled in their own town. And Joseph too, went up from Galilee from the town of Nazareth to Judea, to the city of David, that is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and family of David, to be enrolled with Mary, his betrothed, who was with child, (Lk. 2, 1-5).”

When I read, or hear this passage proclaimed, it always evokes warm feelings within me. It calls me back to when I was young; learning about the birth of Jesus, and the journey of His parents, Mary and Joseph, responding to the call for the first census of the known world. While on this arduous adventure, the Savior of the world was born into the humblest of humble surroundings. I offer these thoughts for two reasons. 1) Our names are particularly important; they are an essential part of our identity. 2) It is important that our voice be heard in the public square, in the Church, and in our families.

This Monday, October 20, you will be asked to cast your vote for leadership within our County of Strathcona and governing leadership within Elk Island Catholic school division. Both of these tasks are important, and each of us have an integral role in the formulation of our County government and our Catholic School governance. I encourage you to ensure your voice is heard on these matters; because you are a key stakeholder, and your voice is an important part of the outcome for these elections. Needless to say, they will need to know who you are when you participate in this process. Your identity, your name, is an essential element to fulfilling your duty as a voting constituent of the County of Strathcona.

My dear sisters and brothers in the Lord, your name and your voice are no less important here at Our Lady of Perpetual Help parish. I am not Ceasar Augustus, and this is not Bethlehem, but the parameters are somewhat the same. We have a sincere desire to know your name, and to provide you with an opportunity for your voice to be heard. The reality is that our faith, and our engagement in the practice of our faith, is far more important than who we choose to oversee our County or our School Board. Yet, it all fits together very beautifully, in the grand scheme and framework of our society.

OLPH has committed to be one of twelve parishes within the Archdiocese who are piloting this census process, using “Flocknote” as our electronic database and mode of collecting information. We do understand that there have been some blips on the radar screen when you have endeavored to fill out your form electronically. I got an “oops” as well, but I did not give up, because I do believe my name is important, and that my voice should be heard. I pray that you feel the same way about your parish community my friends. OLPH is a beautiful Church building, but each and every one of you are what constitutes the Body of Christ, the Church that is OLPH. You are the essence of this wonderful Catholic community.

I recognize and respect that some of you may wish to keep a low profile and “fly under the radar” as it were. We promise not to bother you, but we still need to know who you are, in order to serve you more effectively and more efficiently. Good data informs good decisions, so please take the few minutes necessary to fill in the blanks either electronically or on paper. Electronically, just scan the QR code with the phone on your camera. Or follow the link that was sent to you recently inviting you to fill in the census form in the comfort of your living room. The beauty of this process is that we will gather essential information about who you and your family are. At the end of the census form, there is an opportunity for you to explore ministry, faith formation, sacraments and other opportunities. This, should you desire to take the next step in becoming further involved in the life of your parish community. No obligation, just an invitation and an opportunity.

My friends, on Monday, October 20, you will be asked to stand up and be counted. You will be asked to identify yourself, and let your voice be heard in municipal and school division matters. I, as your pastor, ask you to please do the same with your ecclesial parish community of Our Lady of Perpetual Help. Please tell us who you are, and let your voice be heard here at OLPH. We want to know you, and we want to serve you.
