### It is All About Relationships

It has long been my view, that when we have good relationships, good things happen because of those relationships. When we consider the epitome of what God created human relationship to be, the marriage of a man and woman, often the fruit of that love - that relationship may be new life. A beautiful baby boy or girl. We are very aware of how important good relationships are in the world around us. When we consider the political spectrum, we can see that selfish decisions by a government can have negative effects on whole countries, or on a particular group of working people. When we have a good relationship with our employers, things typically go well, and even the challenges are manageable. I recognize that this is common sense; self-evident pondering.

The relationship between **parish, school and family** is the one we hear mentioned often, at least in the circles I travel. But what does that relationship look like, practically, when it is lived out in an intentional way? Cultivating and growing our relationship with Elk Island Catholic Schools, and the families that are an integral part of our schools and our Church, is central to our mission. Many of these families and these educators, are part of our parish community and have been our focus for as long as I have been part of this flourishing community. What does success look like, when viewed in a pragmatic way? Some highlights, and there are many, that stand out for me follow.

The Sunday morning graduation ceremony for our grade XII Archbishop Jordan High School students, for the past few years, has begun with Mass at the Convention Center. There was a time when Mass for 2,500 people was considered a little too challenging and time consuming to manage, in an already remarkably busy day. Well, here we are, purely because good relationships encourage innovative ideas and collaborations. We celebrate Mass at the Emerald Hills football stadium twice a year, with all the ABJ students and staff. Another first in the past few years. When we celebrate the Eucharist inside the school, we need to split the population and celebrate two Masses, one after the other, as we can only accommodate half of the 1300 students in the gymnasium at a time.

We meet with our ten Sherwood Park school principals 3-4 times per year for the purpose of sharing ideas, dealing with challenges, and collaborating with opportunities presented. It is a wonderful group to gather, because while at the table they can say yes or no to collaborative initiatives and ideas. These meetings also assist in building trust-based relationships.

We have committed to having clergy in each of our ten schools every week, visiting class-rooms and again providing a ministry of presence. The clergy are invited to be part of school retreat days at Camp Van Es and Birch Bay Ranch. This is a terrific way for the young people to see the parish clergy in a different light than at Mass and in their classrooms. It is all about rela-

tionships. The vast majority of our schools budget to bus the whole school to OLPH for Mass at least twice a year, and they each host a time of Eucharistic Adoration within their schools annually. Our EICS teachers and staff will often begin their busy PD days by attending 8:30 am Mass here in the parish. A wonderful initiative, which is supported by the administration of our schools. This past week we had the opportunity to introduce, pray for, and bless the newly elected Elk Island Catholic School Trustees.

I am incredibly grateful for our sacramental preparation programs that have developed and evolved here at OLPH. Baptism, Reconciliation, Eucharist and Confirmation preparation classes all begin with Mass, which is attended by the children and their parents. This is a more profound concept than it may at first appear. For a variety of reasons, our parents may not be regular attendees at our Sunday celebrations. If this is the case for a period of, perhaps years, it becomes more difficult for our parents to re-engage in the life of the parish. With the required attendance with their children at sacramental preparation, the Church door is opened; and a gentle but real invitation is extended. Parents who may not have been involved in Church, perhaps since their child's baptism, are now back for First Reconciliation, and then the First Communion prep immediately following. This presents a beautiful, non-invasive opportunity for our parents to re-engage, and we are seeing good fruit from these opportunities. When the child is engaged, it is often a healthy trigger for the parent to support their children, and their families, on the important journeys of faith.

I want to share something quite remarkable that is a clear expression to me of the fruit of good relationship and open-door policies. Last Sunday, the 12:30pm Mass was celebrated as usual. That day we had a children's choir, about twenty little ones, led by Mr. Siaotong, who teaches at Archbishop Jordan High School. The day before, we had welcomed around 60 young people in the sacrament of Reconciliation. At the 12:30 pm Mass about half of those young people were present, as there was a First Eucharist preparation class following Mass. The registration table, where the children check in with their parents before Mass, was being looked after by a group of Confirmation students, serving their Christian Service hours in the Church no less. At the same time, they are setting an example for the little ones preparing for their First Communion. To put the icing on the cake, we had six altar servers serving the Holy Mass. Following that Mass we had six baptisms at 2:00 pm and Holy Spirit School Parent Council had organized a Halloween party and dance in the Parish Hall from 3:00-5:00 pm.

My point: This engagement of our young people, in several different facets of the parish community simultaneously, was really the culmination of years of collaborations and relationship building between our schools, parents and parish. Good relationships result in good and sometimes remarkable things happening.
