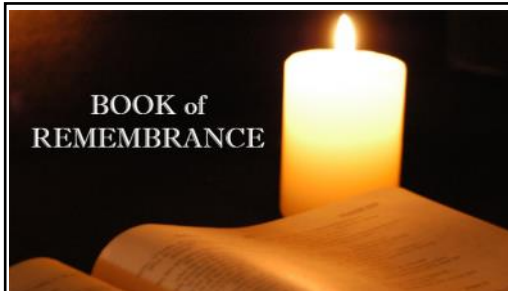

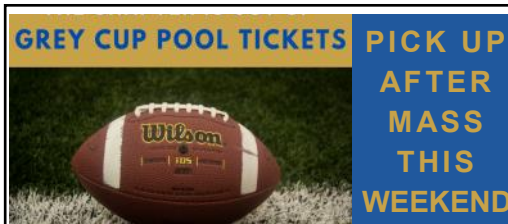

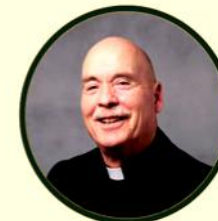

Sign of Hope is the fundraising arm of CSS that raises money to serve thousands of vulnerable individuals across Edmonton, Red Deer and central Alberta. We have twelve programs that rely on Sign of Hope funding each year and other CSS programs that require supplemental funding to enhance our services. Below is a snapshot of our Sign of Hope funded programs that provide a continuum of care to those in need right here in our various communities.

ELDER ABUSE RESOURCE AND SUPPORTS (EARS) program helps hundreds of seniors at risk of abuse and neglect each year through crisis response, risk assessment, outreach, and intervention.

MERCY COUNSELLING provides psychological counselling services - including mental health and wellness - to children, youth, adults, couples and families in Edmonton, Red Deer, Lloydminster, and Vermillion.

ARK EMPLOYMENT SERVICES supports newcomers in Red Deer with job readiness, including resumes and interviews, with a special focus on Ukrainians seeking safety in Canada.

LINKS FOR SUCCESS offers volunteer job placements for Edmonton newcomers to learn about the Canadian workforce. Participants complete an intensive weekly training program before a short placement with a local employer, building the skills and confidence needed for success.

BRIDGE TO BELONGING educates newcomers about Truth and Reconciliation and Indigenous cultures through sessions and hands-on experiences.

SAINT ZITA (EDMONTON, RED DEER, WETASKIWIN & WAINWRIGHT) responds to vulnerable individuals in crisis situations with confidentiality and compassion when they have nowhere else to turn.

LURANA is a first stage, emergency shelter, for women and their children who are fleeing domestic violence and are in need of urgent, safe housing.

LA SALLE is a second stage shelter that helps women and their children escaping domestic violence to transition into stable housing, and rebuild their lives.

MORNING STAR provides outreach and a safe place for vulnerable women in Red Deer to access basic necessities such as food, personal hygiene products, laundry, and shower facilities.

GIANNA CENTRE provides pre and post natal support to vulnerable women and their families through resources and education.

CARE-A-VAN a mobile mini-van that helps unhoused individuals in areas outside of Edmonton's downtown core, providing a range of services and physical supports to those who can't otherwise access them.

WELCOME HOME matches volunteers with recently-housed program participants to provide support and friendship, as clients transition to long term, secure and stable housing.

My friends as you will see in the letter from Fr. Paul Kavanagh, we are celebrating the fifth annual Catholic Social Services Sunday this weekend. CSS is the largest multi-functional social service agency in Alberta. CSS is also one of the largest in Canada; serving more than 21,000 people annually, in twelve communities covering Edmonton and central Alberta. CSS serves people of all creeds and cultures, and their focus is in three specific areas:

- 1. Serving people with disabilities (Community Outreach and Disability Services).
- 2. Serving individuals, children, and families (Children and Family Community Services).
- 3. Serving newcomers to Canada (Immigration settlement services).

CSS was established in 1961 with the founder and leader in this organization being the late Fr. Bill Irwin, a priest of the Archdiocese of Edmonton. Fr. Bill was an amazing priest, leader, and visionary. He understood what would be needed in our communities, in the way of social services. I am proud to say that as a teenager in Fort Saskatchewan, I shoveled snow and did little maintenance jobs for Fr. Bill when he was pastor of Our Lady of the Angels parish, in the early 1970s.

Catholic Social Services operates within a one hundred-million-dollar budget. Most of its funding coming from various levels of government. Needless to say, the vast majority of funding CSS receives is earmarked very specifically to be used for service programs within the above-mentioned areas. This beautiful ministry that is done under the Catholic Social Services banner is a wonderful beacon of Catholic light, in what we know to be a very secular community, with many needs.

The annual “**Sign of Hope**” campaign is Catholic Social Services’ public, non-governmental fundraising arm, within the greater Alberta community. **Together We Serve**, the charitable arm of the Catholic Archdiocese of Edmonton, helps fund **Sign of Hope** with significant dollars each year. (Hence the reason **Sign of Hope** does not carry a higher profile within our parishes, as we already raise funds for it through **Together We Serve**.)

I have the privilege of serving as the chairperson of the 2025 **Sign of Hope** campaign this year. The **Sign of Hope** campaign raises funds that serve twelve programs within the umbrella of Catholic Social Services. Our goal this year is to raise three million dollars during our campaign. Funds raised will support all, or part, of these twelve programs that would simply not exist without **Sign of Hope** funding, because they do not receive any government money. We have included a snapshot of the funded programs in this bulletin for your knowledge.

From my perspective, having an organization with a Catholic name, Catholic roots and values, doing the work of caring for the widow and the orphan in our community is a bright Catholic light in the community.

As the chairperson of the 2025 Catholic Social Services **Sign of Hope** campaign my ask of you is this: Please take the time to inform yourself about the great and vast work that CSS does in our community. Though we will not be running a separate fund-raising campaign in the parish, I ask you to please consider making CSS **Sign of Hope** one of the recipients of your yearly charitable giving. CSS does great and necessary work in our community. They are Catholic in name, and in works. They need and deserve our support. The **Sign of Hope** campaign is a perfect vehicle for all of us to, in an authentic way, care for the widows and the orphans in our greater Alberta community.
