A most beautiful flight is departing to Providence Renewal Centre (PRC) this Friday October 10, and we're inviting all women of the Parish to join the JETS on this ex-


quisite adventure. This is your onboard opportunity to not only tour PRC, but to dis-

Simply, because of the disruption it will cause in the lives of our students, our families, our teachers, and all employees of Elk Island Catholic Schools. Yet here we are, very much on the verge of something that no one really wants; but it appears that there is no alternative way to avoid it. Hence the lemonade out of lemons comment.

Childcare, grandparents, family members, our children and our teachers are all going to be in situations that they would rather not be in, this coming Monday morning. This will come with disruptions to work schedules, day care, after school programming - all of which we will deal with in one way or another, because we must. I am very much a realist, and understand how challenging this will be; for our families and our educators, and all the support staff that make up our Elk Island Catholic School system.

So, can we make some lemonade? What are the positive potentials that can come from this challenging scenario? Though our relationship with our Alberta Government may be strained right now, what about our relationship with Jesus, the master healer? Is this a time, an opportunity, for our families and our young people to attend a daily Mass - either at 8:30 am or 6:15 pm, on any or all days, Monday to Friday? We presently have Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament every Wednesday at 5:15 pm and also Fridays at 7:30 am and 5:15 pm. All our students at Elk Island Catholic Schools have experienced Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, as it is part of their curriculum.

Starting Monday October 6, Our Lady of Perpetual Help parish <u>will offer</u> <u>DAILY Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, Monday to Friday at 5:15 pm</u>, with the express purpose of praying for resolution to this impending labor dispute.

Of course, the Holy Mass will begin at 6:15 pm as it always does. Teachers, staff, students, parents and parishioners, all things are possible with God. We will not fix this on our own, but if we give it to the Lord, good things will definitely be the outcome.

My friends, this coming week, make OLPH one of your go -to sanctuaries; your place of peace, anytime between 7:30 am



and 7:30 pm, seven days a week. Come for one of our two daily Masses, come for Adoration at 5:15 pm every day, Monday to Friday. Pop in <u>any time</u> for a prayer and a chat with dear Jesus.

This Adoration opportunity has been inspired for a specific need, for a specific group in our community. **But we need all our parishioners to come and pray when they are able to do so.** We are a community of faith, and we need to support one another through prayer, worship, and whatever practical actions we can muster; to assist those who are most negatively affected by the coming labor challenges within our Elk Island Catholic school system.

In times and situations like this, one can be left feeling a wee bit helpless, out of sorts, and even overwhelmed. Why? Because we do not know what to do to make things better.

My friends, the answer is prayer, pure and simple. We give our trials and our troubles to the Lord. He who has much broader shoulders than we. He, who wants only good for us, will walk with us on our journey. And though the labor challenges will unfold as they do, He, the giver of all that is good, will soothe our hearts with His healing balm, and allow us

to know we will prevail, whatever the situation brings us during these times.

We are a community of faith, and we must face this impending challenge together. Young and not so young alike, I invite you to come to the church when you are able. Mass every day at 8:30 in the morning. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament every day at 5:15 pm, with Mass to follow at 6:15pm, Monday to Friday.

Our daily 5:15 pm Adoration will continue until our good Lord brings an end to this situation all the good people of our family of Catholic Schools are facing.

Yes my friends, we will pray for all our Alberta schools, but OLPH is ground zero and "mission control" for the parents, students, staff, and parishioners of Elk Island Catholic.
