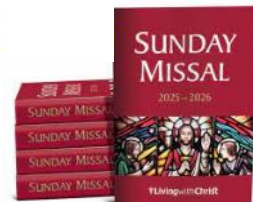

Thanks be to God. Our Holy Father Pope Leo XIV announced today, Friday November 21, 2025, that Most Reverent Stephen Hero has been named the Metropolitan Archbishop of Edmonton. Archbishop-Elect Hero presently serves as the Bishop of the Diocese of Prince Albert, Saskatchewan, where he was ordained to the episcopacy in June 2021. Some of you may know Archbishop-Elect Hero, as he has spent forty of his nearly fifty-five years in the Edmonton area. Our new Archbishop is well prepared to serve as Edmonton's eighth Archbishop.

Archbishop-Elect Hero has a Bachelor of Arts (Philosophy) from Christ the King Seminary in Mission, British Columbia; a Bachelor of Sacred Theology; and a licence in Spiritual Theology from the Angelicum in Rome. He was ordained to the Ministerial Priesthood in June 2000, at St. Joseph's Basilica. (This was one of the first ordinations I ever attended. as I was a seminarian at the time.) Fr. Stephen then served as an associate pastor in a couple of parishes, as well as Vocations Director for the Archdiocese of Edmonton. Fr. Hero returned to Rome and received a Licence in Liturgical Theology from the Pontifical Liturgical Institute in 2005.

Upon returning from studies to Edmonton in 2005, Fr. Hero served as a member of the St. Joseph's Seminary formation team. Simultaneously, he served as a professor at Newman Theological College; in the areas of spirituality, Liturgy, and the Sacraments. In 2010, Fr. Hero was appointed Vice-Rector of the seminary; and in 2012, he became the Rector of St. Joseph's seminary, a role he served for almost ten years. Pope Francis named him Bishop of Diocese of Prince Albert, Saskatchewan, in March 2021, where he has served faithfully for the past four and half years. Archbishop-Elect Hero has been active on various committees within the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops during his time in Prince Albert.

Archbishop-Elect Hero is well-suited to assume the shepherding of this complex Archdiocese. He has lived in this geographic region for most of his life. Twenty of his twenty-five years of priesthood, outside of further studies, have been served in the Edmonton Archdiocese. He is remarkably familiar with the workings of the Seminary and Newman Theological College. In the Archdiocese of Edmonton, we are home to ten publicly funded Catholic School divisions. Covenant Health operates in numerous hospitals within the Archdiocese, and Catholic Social Services is a major facet of the social needs infrastructure of this Archdiocese and the greater community. There are many moving parts to this Archdiocese, and that is outside of the 115 or so Catholic parishes and missions, along with approximately five hundred thousand Catholic faithful who reside within the Archdiocese of Edmonton. Our Catholic Archdiocese of Edmonton is home to about 140 priests, 44 permanent Deacons, 130 religious Sisters, 5 Religious brothers and 13 seminarians.

Suffice to say, Archbishop-Elect Hero will take some time to become more intimately acquainted with the intricacies of this vast Archdiocese; but he is well equipped to do what needs to be done, in order to shepherd the many facets of our Catholic faith within the Archdiocese of Edmonton.

On a personal note, I have had the privilege of interacting with Archbishop-Elect Hero on several separate occasions. I know him by his stellar reputation and as a brother priest. I have the highest regard and respect for Archbishop-Elect Hero and I am convinced that he is the right Bishop for this pivotal mission. I am grateful that Pope Leo has chosen Archbishop-Elect Hero to shepherd our Archdiocese. I know he will do so with great love, and with great diligence and care.

Welcome Your Grace, Archbishop-Elect Stephen Hero, back to your home Diocese, as our Shepherd and Leader. This is an exciting moment in the history of our Church. Thank you dear Jesus and welcome Archbishop Stephen.
