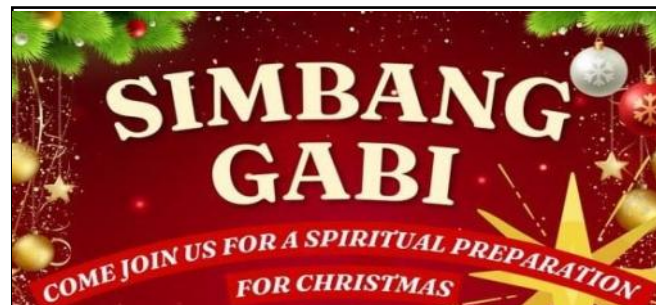


OLPH CWL Christmas Social

*Advent is Upon Us. Are You ready?
Would you like to be ready?
Ready for what?*

The word Advent comes from the Latin word “adventus,” meaning coming or arrival. The advent of spring, the advent of the motor vehicle, the advent of flight...all of these had beginnings or advents.

From a Catholic Christian perspective, advent is a liturgical season of waiting and preparation, that begins four Sundays prior to Christmas. Advent has a dual preparation meaning in the Catholic Church. It is a time each year when we more intentionally prepare for the celebration of the Nativity of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. It is also a time when we are invited to look at the big picture, which is the second coming of Christ; the end times, the final judgement. To be clear, the end times, the final judgement, is not something to be afraid of. It is not an event that should strike fear and trembling, but one that should inspire us with joy and anticipation. God made us to be with Him for eternity, and this time He has given us, is simply a short stop off on the grand plan of eternal life with our Creator. But we need to be prepared, we need to be ready; hence the gift of the Advent season. We prepare joyfully to celebrate the concluding chapter of salvation history in the birth of our Lord; while simultaneously being intentional at viewing the long game of preparing to enter the Kingdom of Heaven.

Are you ready? Would you like to be ready? I know you would. We have begun a couple of initiatives in our parish. Although they flowed out of other impetuses, they certainly complement our parish pastoral priorities; which are Formation for Eucharistic Worship, Formation for Confident Witness and Formation for Service to Marriage and Family. In the Marion month of October, a faithful group of witnesses led the rosary each morning after the daily Mass. There seemed to be a respectable number of parishioners who stayed after Mass to join in the Rosary, so we agreed to try it for the month of November. It has gone well, and there regularly are a considerable number of parishioners who join in the Rosary following the 8:30 am morning Mass. To give you some context, we average between 50 and 100 hundred parishioners who attend our weekday Masses. Consistently, there has been 20 to 30 who have stayed to pray the Rosary following Mass.

In conversation with those who have faithfully led the rosary for the past two months, we have agreed to continue this devotional practice throughout the Advent season. I invite you to join us in the Rosary following the Holy Mass; either in person, or by way of our livestream opportunities. This can be a wonderful opportunity to prepare for the celebration of the Nativity of the Lord, during the Advent season, with your community of faith. As well, it can allow us time to reflect on that which is to come; and how we will prepare ourselves to live our lives in joyful anticipation of finally meeting the Lord, face to face, for eternity. A pretty exciting thought to meditate on, during the praying of the Holy Rosary.

When the labor dispute began between our educators and the government in late September, we began hosting a Holy Hour every evening at 5:15 pm, Monday to Friday, prior to our 6:15 evening weekday Masses. Though the labor dispute was not resolved in a manner that all were happy with, we decided to continue adoration at 5:15 pm, because the faithful continue to attend. Here we are, now two months later, and a small but very faithful group of parishioners have continued to attend the daily Holy Hour. In consultation with our Pastoral Priorities Team, we have decided to continue adoration before the weekday evening Masses, at least until Christmas. We are going with the age-old but true maxim, “If you build it, they will come.” We have experienced the truth of this wisdom in the offering of the sacrament of Reconciliation after each of our daily Masses. It has taken time, but there are always folks who wish to avail themselves of this beautiful sacrament.

My friends, to spend a few minutes or more in the Lord’s presence will always serve you well. The Lord Jesus wants to be our friend. He loves us. When we come to spend time with Him, we are doing what we can to show Him our desire to be His friends as well. Advent is a time when we prepare, and then we wait. I can not think of more appropriate devotional practices than the Rosary, or a Holy Hour, to prepare for the Nativity of our Lord; and longer term to prepare ourselves for when He comes again, in all His glory.

Advent is upon us. Are you ready? Would you like to be ready?
