



How is your ADVENT going?

My friends, two weekends ago, we witnessed 59 young people receive their First Holy Communion, spread out over four Masses. Last Sunday, we initiated 37 young men and women into full communion in the Catholic Church via the sacrament of Confirmation. On that same weekend, we held our Reverse Collection for the food that will go into making Christmas hampers for the good people in need at St. Alphonsus and Sacred Heart Church of the First Peoples. Both these inner-city parishes will benefit from the food hampers that will be made up and delivered from Our Lady of Perpetual Help parish. Please do your best and remember to bring your food item to Mass this weekend. We will be sorting, packaging, and then delivering on Monday or Tuesday of this coming week. Last weekend was also Pastoral Priorities Sunday, so we blessed all couples celebrating wedding anniversaries in December, and hosted lovely hospitality and fellowship events after our five Masses. Yes, it was a full weekend, thank you dear Jesus!

By the time you read this, we will have already hosted almost all of our schools with Masses at the parish, and/or Advent concerts, which began with evening Mass. For me, this is a beautiful collaborative relationship between our schools, our parish, and our families. These are valuable connections for our young people to make during their formative school years. School concerts, in the Church, with family present, beginning with Mass. I am not sure there is anything more memorable we can do for our kids, from a *connecting-Church-to-good-memories* perspective.

As we journey through this Advent season, it is my hope that you are thinking about how or what you might engage in, to make this season a growth opportunity on your faith journey. I do have a couple of suggestions...

When I am speaking with the young ones, I ask them: "If Jesus were coming to your home for a visit, would you make sure your room was clean and your bed was made?" Of course, the response is yes! Well, my friends, we need to make our hearts neat and tidy as we prepare to celebrate the nativity of Jesus in the coming days. **On Saturday December 20, we will host a Day of Confessions from 9:15 am to 4:30 pm.** We will have at least four priests available for confessions all day long. This is a fantastic opportunity for everyone. Whether you confess once a month, once a year, or have not been to confession for much longer, WELCOME. This is a wonderful opportunity to shed a few of the pounds, that we all carry around, but do not need to. I go to confession monthly and find it a wonderful freeing experience. Why do I go once a month? Because I need to. And going once a month, I can actually keep track of whether I am making spiritual progress or not. We all fall short of the created goodness that God made us, and confes-

sion is a wonderful place to "take out the garbage," which will assist us in progressing on our individual faith journeys.

The other opportunity that I invite you to challenge yourself with is this: **Simbang Gabi**. This a nine-day series of Masses, a Novena of Masses anticipating and celebrating the birth of our Lord Jesus. The Mass is in English and the hymns are in Tagalog. These are joyful celebrations to be part of! There are a number of parishes in the greater Edmonton area who host Simbang Gabi novena Masses. Typically, they are held at 7:00 in the evening for the nine days. We at OLPH have a unique twist to these celebrations. We celebrate them in the early morning at **5:30 am**, beginning Tuesday December 16, with the last novena Mass being celebrated on the morning of December 24. Now before you dismiss this as craziness, I encourage you to attend one of these Masses. Then go back home to bed if you like. Though you really will not want to miss the nice breakfast that will pop up in the foyer right after Mass. 0530 is not for everyone, for sure, but am sure you will not regret joining us for one of these Masses. Trust me, you want to be able to say "Yes, I have been to an early morning Simbang Gabi Mass." (If for no other reason than bragging rights.)

The origins of these novena Masses began in the Philippines, a very Catholic country, and is typically celebrated at about 4:00 am. This time suited the fishermen, who were coming home from a night of fishing, and the farmers who were heading out to their fields to work for the day. Some coming, some going, but all would stop at the church for Mass on their way. A beautiful witness of discipleship in my books.

Finally, as you think about charitable giving and the associated tax benefits, as we come to the close of the fiscal year, please do keep Our Lady of Perpetual Help in mind. **Together We Serve**, the charitable arm of the Edmonton Catholic Archdiocese, would be incredibly happy with any end of the year assistance, to get us over the goal we have set for our parish community.

My friends, by God's good grace and our cooperation with that grace, there are many good things happening here at OLPH. Thank you, dear Jesus. I encourage you to jump on this bus - it is headed in the direction we all want to go.
