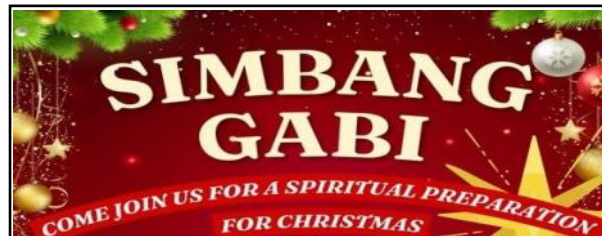

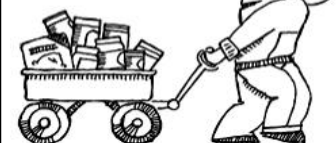

FR. JIM



Are you Ready?

Yes, I mean ready for Christmas. When I speak with the little ones, I ask them, “if Jesus was coming to your house, would you make sure your room was clean?” Suffice to say, the answer is always “yes.”

We need to prepare our hearts for the Nativity of the Lord as well. He comes into our hearts in real time, when we receive the Holy Eucharist. He came to us in real time, over two thousand years ago, as a humble, helpless, human baby; trusting in the love of His parents, Mary and Joseph, for all His needs. Now, He invites us to trust in Him, absolutely, for all our needs. My friends, our Lord Jesus Christ is the one immutable truth that will never, ever let us down or forget us. Thank you, dear Jesus.

So, what’s up for Christmas with you and your family? My guess, is that at some point there will be a discussion about which Mass should we attend. Well, we know there are a plethora of options! **Christmas Eve at 4:00 pm, 6:00 pm, 8:00 pm, 10:00 pm, and midnight. On Christmas Day at 8:30 am, 10:30 am, 12:30 pm, and 7:00 pm, plus 11:00 am at St. Francis of Assisi in Tofield.**

Did you know that there are only two **holy days of obligation** in the Canadian Catholic Church? Yes: Christmas (Nativity of the Lord) and New Year’s Day (Mary, the Mother of God). Oh yeah, there are fifty-two other holy days of obligation, which follow consistently Sunday after Sunday, decade after decade, millennium after millennium.

So, what’s up for Christmas with you and your family? Which Mass will you attend? A couple of, what I hope might be, helpful thoughts...

Last week in my homily I suggested that we switch from a “**hurry up and wait**” mentality, to a “**slow down and wait**” mentality. Christmas is a joyful time of gathering the family, sometimes from the far reaches of the world; to gather around the family table, with immense joy and excitement. This is the way it should be. Our families of origin, and the families we marry into, are God’s gift to us; as children and as adults. The tendency can be to go forward with the thinking, “Let’s hurry up and do what we need do, so we can slow down and do what we want to do.” This is natural, I would say, with the excitement of family being present, perhaps for the first time in many months. We all know we need to get to Mass, so there can be a temptation to want to “get that done and get home” for our social, family, fun, celebrations. I suggest we might slow down and wait.

My friends, the 4:00 pm Mass on Christmas Eve, though joyful in and of itself, just because of sheer numbers, is not a lot different than the parking lot at Costco during the week before Christmas. Seating at the 4:00 pm is not a sure thing, because of the crowds. **Why not**

slow down and wait? Have an early family supper or Happy Hour, and come to the 6:00 pm or 8:00 pm Mass instead. We will get you in and out in an hour, and the church parking lot will not be like the south-west leg of the Henday during rush hour.

Another thought: Enjoy the afternoon and evening with your family, and then jump in the car and come to the 10:00 pm or midnight Mass; where seating is guaranteed, and where you can give thanks in a quiet atmosphere for all the blessings our Lord has provided you with, including your beautiful family. (Note: Incense will be used at midnight.) Of course, and it is understood, Christmas Day Mass is another great option! The 10:30 am Mass is usually jam-packed, but the 8:30 am, 12:30 pm and 7:00 pm Masses are great options as well.


I am not trying to tell you what time you should attend Mass this Christmas, but if peace and quiet are on your agenda, the 4:00 pm Mass is not for you. It would be good to leave this one for our many families with young ones. You can be sure that the homily will be child-friendly. Regardless of what decisions you make my friends, as we conclude this final short week of Advent, we welcome you wherever and whenever you show up. Our Lady of Perpetual Help parish is dynamic, it is flourishing and it is because you are an active part of our community.

May the Lord continue to bless you and yours, as you enter the final count-down to the Nativity of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.
