Happy Advent, My Friends!

Often my writing/ramblings refer to the spiritual life of our parish faith community. It has been suggested that I provide an update on the physical facility, and life of our parish, at this time. I agree with this proposal.

What I can say about our clergy personnel situation, is that we are not aware of any solutions in the immediate future. Fr. Paul Kavanagh and I now have a code when we talk about updates to the clergy situation: He says, “Two weeks,” then I smile, and say “Okay.” We have been saying two weeks for a few months now. This clergy replacement scenario is a wee bit like the second coming (tongue in cheek). We are certain it will happen at one point, but only our “Father in Heaven knows when, (Mt. 24, 36).”

Last year, we faced reality and made the decision to completely replace the vaulted roofing system of our parish. This, after years of blood, sweat, tears, and \$ patching and covering areas we felt were the problem. Eventually we came to understand that the vapor barrier was no longer doing what it needed to do. So, for just less than a million dollars, we have a new roof and thank you dear Jesus, no more leakage.

With the integrity of the building envelope now at a reasonable comfort level, we can move forward with beautifying the interior of our Lord’s house, OLPH, here in Sherwood Park. What will this look like? I am hoping that ninety-nine percent of our faithful are happy with the beautiful renovation to the sanctuary flooring. It now no longer looks like your living room but more like the Holy of Holies that it is. Next steps: 1) To overhaul our water-stained lower ceilings in the nave of the Church. 2) To do a repaint of all wall and ceiling areas in the transepts and nave of the Church. 3) To replace the carpet in the east and west transepts of the Church and the carpet under all eight pew sections within the nave of the Church. 4) There is an ongoing plan to overhaul the hardware on our kneelers in the pews to assist in quieting them down when raising and lowering them. 5) All aisles and open areas within the nave of the Church will be replaced with high-quality rubberized flooring. From a hygiene and maintenance perspective this will be a big assist. It is easy to clean and there will be less potential for dust build-up in the flooring, and hence in the air we breathe within the Church. We have seen the benefits of this type of flooring system in a couple of the other larger Churches in South Edmonton. So, all aisles, and open carpeted areas, in front of the pews, and behind them, will be finished with this high-quality rubberized flooring.

So, the two next questions: When will all this take place? How much will it cost? Well, in this situation, thankfully, it is not just our Father in heaven who knows! The flooring will be a two month or so delivery. We ordered it last week. The major concern for our parishioners will be the two months after Christmas. We will overhaul one transept at a time. This will mean hanging a dividing curtain along the north-south main beams in the nave of the Church to separate the

transept from the main body of the Church. It is estimated that it will take just less than a month, for the work on each transept to be completed. The goal is to have this part of the project complete before Holy Week. The flooring and the carpeting under the pews will be done in sections, in complimentary coordination with the transepts project. The symmetry, timing and coordination of these projects is still being discerned. The total cost for this interior upgrade is about three hundred thousand dollars. We have followed a diligent three bidder process, for the distinct phases of this project.

The work will impact our Mass celebrations. There is a good possibility that we may need to move into the parish hall once again for week-day Mass, as at least some of the work will be noisy. We need to give our contractors a decent window of work time during the day to complete their work. Our Sunday Masses will still be in the nave. We will need to shift our folks around somewhat, and make effective use of available space behind the pews and in the transepts. In preparation for this work, **we will need a contingent of volunteers who are prepared to move pews and other duties as delegated at various stages of this project.**

I am incredibly pleased with our volunteer Project/Maintenance team. We have many gifted parishioners who have again stepped up to share their time and talent. This includes one very generous parishioner, who has donated in a very significant financial way to this project, in honor of her late husband. It is a beautiful thing for me to see the way so many gifts and generous hearts come together to share their time, talent, and treasure; giving glory to our Lord, and making His house a beautiful place of worship.

As we prepare our hearts to celebrate the Nativity of our Lord and Savior, it is good that we prepare His house. I hope this update gives you more answers than questions.

You can also sign up for (PAD) Pre-Authorized Debit to ensure your regular contributions happen automatically, even when you cannot come to the church in person.
