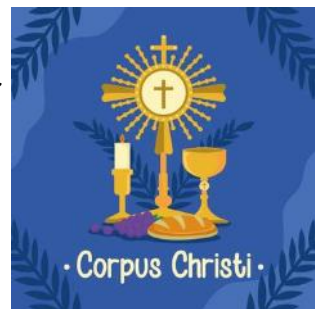

Pope Leo XIV's First Encyclical Letter: Magnifica Humanitas



Pope Leo XIV's Encyclical Letter, [*Magnifica Humanitas*](#), was released on Monday May 25, 2026. It focuses on safeguarding the human person in the time of artificial intelligence. The letter is dated 15 May, to commemorate the 135th anniversary of Pope Leo XIII's Encyclical Letter, [*Rerum Novarum*](#).

The Dicastery for Promoting Integral Human Development offers the following synopsis of the Encyclical Letter: **"Magnifica Humanitas offers insights into the protection of the human person in the age of artificial intelligence, recognizing a profound epochal shift. It places the dignity of the human person at the centre as the criteria for guiding technical progress. The Church's social teaching accompanies these transformations, pointing to the common good, solidarity and subsidiarity as the fundamental benchmarks for understanding and interpreting the transformation currently underway. It proposes, as an alternative to the culture of power and war, a civilization of love founded on justice, dialogue and shared responsibility."**

Unsung Heros

This beautiful parish of ours has a plethora of activities, ministries, faith growth opportunities. It all seems to happen rather seamlessly because of the commitment of so many faithful parishioners to their particular area of focus.

Some of these ministries and activities are relatively obvious to us. For instance, the large number of individuals that participate at each of our Sunday Masses. Including set up before hand, we require a minimum of twenty or so parishioners who have all signed up ahead of time to be intentionally engaged in making our Mass beautiful. Between ushers, greeters, proclaimers, Eucharistic Ministers, adult servers, altar servers, musicians and AV techs, a significant number of parishioners must be intentional in order for our celebrations to be beautiful and timely.

One of our team members that many of you may not know or perhaps have never even seen is Lito Augustin, our custodian. Lito works three hours a day, six days a week, and arrives to the parish before 6:00 am each day except for Sunday. He does a remarkable job of keeping a very large facility clean on a weekly basis. This is an unnoticed but essential part of making our parish a friendly, welcoming place of worship. Thank you Lito. You are appreciated for all that you do, unseen as it may be.

We have a group of ladies who arrive here every second Monday, volunteering their cleaning expertise in the nave of our Church. Again, you may have never seen them in action. They usually come after the Monday morning Mass, grab their vacuum cleaners and go about their business. My friends, vacuuming between each and every pew is not for the faint of heart, but these dust-busting ladies are a force to be reckoned with. I have great admiration and appreciation for the gift that these gals bring to the parish, because it is not one of mine. I can do it, but I don't look forward to it; and truthfully, I am not that good at it either. Thank you for your service, ladies.

The other unsung heroes I would like to focus on this day is our Funeral Lunch Ministry. We average about fifty funerals a year here at OLPH parish. We do, I believe, a good job of supporting our dear people who have experienced the loss of a loved one. In the planning of the funeral and in the celebration of the funeral Mass; we offer good music, good AV and good communication and support from start to finish. I believe another area we excel in, is the luncheons that our volunteer teams prepare and serve the families after the funeral Mass. The Mass of Christian burial is essential for the care of the deceased and for providing peace in the hearts of those who remain.

The opportunity to gather in the parish hall after the funeral for a lovely lunch, perhaps a video tribute with a speaker or two, is a wonderful way to bring closure at a difficult time. The luncheon provides a guaranteed opportunity to visit with family and friends whom you may not

have seen for some years. This is a time when some of the real healing can occur amongst the grieving families.

Our Funeral Lunch teams go about their prep work prior to and during the funeral Mass. (While prepping food, they can view the Mass on video screens in the kitchen). When the family arrives to the hall the tables are set, there is a beautiful luncheon buffet laid out, and the ladies are there to pour coffee, drinks and replenish food supplies.

I am deeply grateful for the tireless work these teams perform, solely for the good of those who are mourning. It is a beautiful way to walk with a family, through what is often a very traumatic time in their lives. Our AV techs are present to play a video tribute for them, and it really provides a very lovely atmosphere for those who have experienced loss.

A simple thank you this weekend to all who serve, but in particular to our unsung heroes who serve so selflessly behind the scenes; doing their part to make our parish truly a welcoming community.
